► TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF 56th ROAD, between Laurel Hill Boulevard and 43rd Street

Please look for and observe all construction signs and barriers so that work can proceed in a timely manner.

The New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) has awarded a \$555 million contract to construct Phase 1 of the new Kosciuszko Bridge. On March 3rd and 4th, from 7:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. (weather permitting), NYSDOT will:

- close 56th Road in both directions, between Laurel Hill Boulevard and 43rd Street, for welding and installation of deck support brackets. Variable message signs and traffic enforcement agents (TEAs) will be used to manage traffic during this operation. In addition, parking will be restricted on 43rd Street, 56th Road and Laurel Hill Boulevard, as shown on the accompanying map.

Detours:

- 1) Motorists traveling westbound on 56th Road should turn right on 43rd Street, left on 54th Road and left on Laurel Hill Boulevard to 56th Road.
- 2) Motorists traveling eastbound on 56th Road should turn left on Laurel Hill Boulevard, right on 54th Road and right on 43rd Street to 56th Road.

The new Kosciuszko Bridge will improve traffic safety, reduce congestion and improve travel speeds. Enhancements to the roadway will include extra lanes, wider lanes and a reduced incline creating longer sight lines and increased visibility. The project will also include a new bikeway/walkway on the bridge; new parks and open spaces; improved access to the waterfront; and enhancements to local streets. The project is part of the New York Works Program, created to generate jobs and increase economic development.

The project team will make every effort to minimize impacts during this large construction project. However, some disruption and inconvenience typically occur on any construction project, including changes to vehicle and pedestrian traffic patterns, loss of parking, noise, vibrations, and dust. To promptly and proactively address community concerns, NYSDOT has hired a full-time **community liaison, Christine Holowacz**.
