

A Word from the District Manager ...

Landlord and Tenants

Heat - Heat must be supplied from October 1st through May 31st to tenants of multiple dwellings. If the outdoor temperature falls below 55°F between the hours of 6am and 10 pm, each apartment must be heated to a temperature of least 68° F. If the outdoor temperature falls below 40°F between the hours of 10pm and 6am each apartment must be heated to a temperature of at least 55°.

Hot Water - Landlords must provide all tenants of multiple dwellings with both hot and cold water [YEAR ROUND]. Hot water must register at or above a constant temperature of 120° F at the tap. If a tub or shower is equipped with an anti-scald valve that prevents the hot water temperature from exceeding 120° F, the minimum hot water temperature for that tub or shower is 110° F.

Con Edison will pay residential customers up to \$1,000 for replacing old equipment with new energy efficient equipment or for taking other steps to save energy and money. Some upgrades can reduce heating costs by 30 percent.

Con Edison will also pay \$50 to residential customers who let the company pick up their old refrigerator or freezer.

Department of Homeless Services

On January 25, 2016, thousands of volunteers will fan out across the five boroughs to participate in the annual Homeless Outreach Population Estimate (HOPE). Conducting the survey through the early morning hours, participants become the eyes and ear of the City, canvassing streets, parks and other public spaces to identify individuals living unsheltered. The sign will be unveiled by Council Majority Leader Jimmy Van Bramer with Dr. Thaisa Way of the University of Washington, the foremost expert of Cautley's career.

MTA New York City Transit

2015 Flushing 7 Line Schedule of Work

The MTA New York City Transit (NYCT) has been making capital improvements on the Flushing 7 line over the past several years to improve the entire line's long-term capacity and reliability. This work has involved three major, multi-year projects: the implementation of **Communications-Based Train Control**, the **replacement of elevated track panels**, and the **reconstruction and fortification of the Steinway Tubes**. Work will be continuing on these projects into 2015, which means that NYCT will require new service suspensions and disruptions on the 7 line while this work is performed. Emergency Snow Laborers Needed: Register Now to Help Clear Snow and Ice After Major Winter Storms

Registration has begun for emergency snow laborers for the upcoming snow season. Snow laborers are per diem workers who are called upon to remove snow and ice citywide from bus stops, crosswalks, fire hydrants and step streets in the City after heavy snowfalls. Individuals interested in registering with the DSNY can do so at their local district garage, weekdays between 7am and 3pm. The list of garage locations can be found at www.nyc.gov/sanitation. Snow laborers will be paid \$13.50 per hour, and \$20.25 per hour after 40 hours are worked in a week. Applicants must be at least 18 years of age, be eligible to work in the United States, and capable of performing heavy physical labor.
