

NYC Fire Department

Celebrate your heritage safely with the following guidelines

50% of all apartment fires and one-quarter of the fires in private homes start in the kitchen

Stay in the kitchen-don't leave cooking food unattended.

Loose sleeves are more likely to catch on fire or get caught on pot handles.

Turn pot handles inward, facing the wall, to prevent burns caused by overturning or spills.

Keep area clear of towels, papers or anything that could burn.

Have a pot lid and container of baking soda handy to smother a pan fire. **DO NOT USE WATER!**

Treat burns immediately with cool running water and seek medical attention.

Holiday time means candles, matches and fire. When burning candles, make your home safe. Keep candles away from bedding, tablecloths, clothing or anything that can burn. Use a flashlight for hard-to-reach places.

What is the NYC Rent Freeze Program?

The NYC Rent Freeze Program, which includes the Senior Citizen Rent Increase Exemption (SCRIE) Program and the Disability Rent Increase Exemption (DRIE) Program, helps those eligible stay in affordable housing by freezing their rent.

Under this program, a property tax credit covers the difference between the actual rent amount and what you (the tenant) are responsible for paying at the frozen rate.

The longer you are in the program, the greater the benefit. For example, if you enter the program today, continue to renew and meet all eligibility requirements, the current amount you pay for rent today will be the same in 20 years.

If you are a senior or a person with a disability, these websites www.nyc.gov/contactscrie or www.nyc.gov/contactdrie will provide you with all of the necessary information you need, including eligibility requirements, the application process, benefits, renewals and answers to frequently asked questions

NYC Department of Health & Mental Hygiene

The NYC Health Department alerted NYC residents about a scam involving fake pest control violation notices issued by "Vermin Control of New York." The notice demands payment for alleged "assessment and eradication of vermin" in the amount of \$120. New Yorkers should know that the Health Department never issues a notice of violation demanding immediate payment. The Health Department is investigating these notices and any New Yorker receiving a notice should immediately contact 311.
