NYC City Council Redistricting Public Hearings

Every 10 years, the boundary lines of City Council districts are redrawn to adjust for population growth. The New York City Districting Commission will be holding Public Hearings to obtain additional public input regarding the plan for dividing New York City into fifty-one districts for the election of members of the City Council, prior to its final adoption. Winter Health and Safety Tips

Tips for Staying Warm

Exposure to cold can cause life-threatening health conditions. Avoid serious conditions such as frostbite and hypothermia, by keeping warm.

- Wear a hat, hood, or scarf, as most heat is lost through the head.
- Wear layers, as they provide better insulation and warmth. Keep clothing dry; if a layer becomes wet, remove it.
- Keep fingertips, earlobes, and noses covered if you go outside.



New Year’s Eve Safety Tips

- If you drink, DON’T DRIVE, no matter how little you think you have had. Designate a driver before you arrive at an event or party
- NEVER get into a car that’s being operated by someone who’s been drinking and dissuade anyone that has been drinking from driving at all.
- If hosting a party, make sure to set rules on drinking and driving. Offer to provide a ride home or a place for guests who drink to sleep.
- If possible, avoid driving during the early and late evening hours around New Years Eve. Protect yourself and passengers by wearing a safety belt at all times, in case of a crash.
- If you’re going to a bar or a club to have a few drinks, someone who’s not drinking should be along to drive you home. If not, call a taxi. You may have to go back and pick up your car the next day, but it’s worth it.
- "Ride Home" services may be available so that you won’t have to come back and retrieve your vehicle.
