Con Ed: 10 TIPS To Help You Go Green And Save Some Green

1. Shut off any lights you aren't using.
2. Use compact fluorescent light bulbs. They use less than 25 % of the electricity standard bulbs use and last 10 times longer. If every home in NYC replaced 75% of their regular light bulbs with CFL's, we would save enough energy to run all the city's subways and light all the train stations.
3. Seal drafty windows, doors, and holes around plumbing fixtures to keep the cold out in the winter & heat out in the summer.
4. Use the energy saving setting for all appliances, particularly your refrigerator, air conditioner, washing machine, clothes dryer, and dishwasher.
5. Unplug TV's, cable boxes and modems, computers, and monitors when not in use. Plug home-entertainment and computer equipment into power strips, so it's one easy switch to turn them on & off.
6. Unplug your cell phone, MP3 player, and PDA chargers when not in use. They use electricity, even when they aren't charging.
7. Consider ENERGY STAR –qualified appliances, which use 10 to 50 percent less electricity than standard models. A list of ENERGY STAR– qualified products is available at www.energystar.gov
8. Switch to green power. If 10% of New York households chose green power, it would reduce the state's annual carbon dioxide emissions by 3 billion pounds. To find out more, visit www.Poweryourway.com or call 1-800-780-2884
9. Switch to paperless bank statements and online bill paying. Pay your Con Edison bill online; go to www.conEd.com/customercentral. If all U.S. homes viewed and paid their bills electronically, we would save 18.5 million trees.
10. Drive less. Walk or take public transportation.

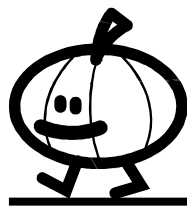
