DDC STARTS RICHMOND HILL QUEENS PROJECT Mobilization, Installation of Water Main Restrictions to Curbside Parking and Driveway Access

MYRTLE AVENUE BETWEEN 111TH STREET & 115TH STREET
(Monday-Friday)

On/about Monday, November 9, 2015–Friday, November 13, 2015

On/about Monday, November 9, 2015–Friday, November 13, 2015, the Department of Design and Construction (NYC-DDC) will begin a construction project to install/replace water mains on 108th Street and surrounding areas. Work scheduled on this project includes mobilization, and install/replace existing water mains. To facilitate these activities, parking restrictions will be in effective on Myrtle Avenue between 111th Street & 115th Street. **“No Parking”** signs will be posted for the duration of these activities, and **“No Parking” is permitted within 100 feet of work site intersections in all directions of traffic.**

WHAT WORK WILL BE DONE?

- Mobilization
- Installation of fire hydrants (fire protection)
- Installation/replacement of existing water mains

WHERE WILL WORK BE PERFORMED?

Myrtle Avenue between 111th Street & 115th Street

WHAT ARE THE COMMUNITY IMPACTS?

The DDC is committed to maintaining a work site that is safe and clean. However, dust, noise and heavy equipment are common elements of construction and we ask for your patience during the project. There may be limited street access on certain blocks. However, deliveries to commercial and residential properties and emergency vehicle access will be allowed. In addition, the DDC will be baiting the construction zone on a regular basis to control rodent populations.



Water Service Interruptions?

During the course of this project, temporary water service disruptions will be necessary in order to replace the water mains. If it is necessary for DDC to turn off your water service, you will receive written notice by 4 p.m. the day before service interruption. Water service will be restored everyday by 6pm. If additional shut downs are required you will receive a new notice daily until work is completed.

Pedestrian / Traffic

- ❖ Pedestrian access to buildings will be maintained at all times.
- ❖ Street closures may be required; warning signs will be posted in advance.
- ❖ Driveway access may be temporarily interrupted in order to complete construction.

Public transportation

- ❖ Bus stops and/or bus routes may be relocated/detoured during the course of this construction. Signs and directions will be posted noting the changes.

WHAT ARE THE HOURS OF WORK?

As per NYC-DOT OCMC permits, typical work hours will be Monday-Friday from 7:00 am to 6:00 pm. However, advance notice will be given of any work outside of typical daytime hours.
