

Quarterly Report on Homeless Deaths # 12
New York City Department of Health and Mental Hygiene
Bureau of Vital Statistics
Local Law 63 of 2005
April 1, 2008 – June 30, 2008

Introduction. This report has been prepared and submitted pursuant to Local Law 63 of 2005 (LL63) amending the Administrative Code of the City of New York to track and report deaths of homeless persons in the City of New York. Data contained in this report are for the quarter period of April 1, 2008 – June 30, 2008 and were provided by the NYC Office of Chief Medical Examiner (OCME), the NYC Department of Homeless Services (DHS), the NYC Department of Housing Preservation and Development (HPD) and the NYC Human Resources Administration (HRA) to the NYC Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (DOHMH).

DHS, HPD and HRA maintain records on the homeless individuals for whom they provide temporary housing in New York City. OCME, through its responsibilities investigating NYC deaths, investigates the deaths of some homeless individuals. Data from these agencies were compiled, matched against NYC death certificates and analyzed by the DOHMH Office of Vital Statistics and are presented herein.

Definitions. As defined in LL63, a “homeless person” is a person who at the time of death did not have a known street address of a residence at which he or she was known or reasonably believed to have resided. A “homeless shelter resident” is “a person who at the time of death lived in a homeless shelter. A “homeless shelter” is “(i) a residence operated by or on behalf of the department of homeless services; (ii) an emergency residence operated by or on behalf of the department of social services/human resources administration which is available primarily for homeless persons with HIV or AIDS related illness; or (iii) a residence operated by or on behalf of the department of housing preservation and development to the extent that such residence houses clients of the department of homeless services; provided, however that such term shall not include any residence that is available primarily for battered women.”


Methods. Based on definitions above, incident reports were provided by OCME, DHS and HPD. Information from corresponding NYC death certificates were used to validate agency reports and remove any duplicates among them (i.e. when DHS cases are also OCME cases). HRA did not disclose any identifiable information on HRA homeless residents, per Article 27-F of the New York State Public Health Law, which prohibits disclosure of information that could reasonably identify someone as having an HIV-related illness or AIDS. As a result, HRA homeless deaths cannot be combined with DHS, HPD and OCME deaths and total NYC homeless deaths cannot be ascertained.

DEATHS OF HOMELESS PERSONS AND HOMELESS SHELTER RESIDENTS

Reported Homeless Deaths

OCME, DHS and HPD reported a total of 45 homeless deaths between April 1 and June 30, 2008. Of the total reported this quarter, 43 were investigated by OCME. On average, over the previous 11 quarters, 40 deaths have been reported per quarter. Deaths have ranged from 22 to 61 during the previous 11 quarters. There were 61 deaths last quarter.

The trend chart below displays deaths over all 12 quarters. First and second annual reports include final data for quarters 1-4 and 5-8 respectively. The data for quarters 9 -12 are preliminary, and may change with late reporting. These changes will be reflected in the annual report.



Twenty-six of the 45 deaths occurred in Manhattan, 6 in the Bronx, 9 in Brooklyn, 2 in Queens, and 2 in Staten Island.

HRA reported 15 homeless deaths this quarter; 9 were reported in the previous quarter (Table 1). Among the 15 HRA deaths reported, 8 were in Manhattan, 4 in the Bronx, 2 in Brooklyn, 1 in Queens, and none in Staten Island.

Decedent Shelter Residency Status and Shelter Location

Among the 45 OCME, DHS and HPD-reported homeless deaths, 13 (29%) were reported to have been a resident of a shelter system at the time of death, and 32 (71%) were not sheltered (Table 1). Of the 13 sheltered, 9 died in Manhattan, 1 in the Bronx, 3 in Brooklyn, and none in Queens and Staten Island. Of the 32 unsheltered, 17 died in Manhattan, 5 in the Bronx, 6 in Brooklyn, 2 in Queens, and 2 in Staten Island.

The percent of sheltered decedents over total decedents has ranged from 34% to 86% during the previous 11 quarters. Of the 13 sheltered homeless decedents identified by OCME, DHS and HPD this quarter, 9 were sheltered in Manhattan and 4 were sheltered in Brooklyn (Table 2).

Please note that HRA reports residents living in Single Room Occupancies (SROs) as homeless sheltered residents. SROs are not homeless shelters. These decedents had been provided with temporary emergency housing and, according to LL63 definition, are classified as homeless sheltered residents.

Homeless Decedents Investigated by OCME

Among the 45 homeless deaths reported by OCME, DHS and HPD, 43 (96%) were investigated by OCME (Table 1). The OCME investigated 85% of the sheltered homeless deaths, and 100% of the unsheltered homeless deaths. While the percent of deaths investigated by the OCME fluctuates, communication amongst OCME, DHS, and DOHMH has improved as a result of a Memorandum of Understanding enabling detailed data sharing between DHS and DOHMH. Further information on this memorandum is provided in the first annual report. OCME also notifies DHS in real time of every suspected homeless death.

Homeless Decedent Location of Death by Borough and Community District

The location of OCME, DHS and HPD-reported deaths (i.e. in shelter, in a hospital, outdoors or other), disaggregated by borough, community district and shelter residency status, are shown in Table 3. HRA homeless deaths by location of death are presented separately in Table 4 by borough only, as required by LL63.

Among the 45 OCME, DHS and HPD deaths, 4 (9%) occurred at a shelter, 23 (51%) in a hospital, 8 (18%) outdoors and 10 (22%) in an “other” location. The number of homeless decedents who died outdoors has ranged from 3 to 20 decedents per quarter over the previous 11 quarterly reports. Those who died in “other” locations have ranged from 1 to 18 decedents per quarter. Among the 8 outdoor deaths reported this quarter, 2 were in Manhattan, 2 in the Bronx, 2 in Brooklyn, and 2 were in Queens. Among the 10 “other” location deaths, 4 died in Manhattan, 2 in the Bronx, 2 in Brooklyn, and 2 in Staten Island.

The distribution of location of death among the 13 sheltered homeless decedents was as follows: 8 died in the hospital, 4 died at the homeless shelter, and 1 died outdoors (Table 3). The sheltered outdoor death was found on a bench.

The distribution of location of death among the 32 non-sheltered was as follows: 15 died in a hospital, 7 outdoors and 10 in “other” locations. Among the 7 non-sheltered outdoor deaths, 3 were found in vans/vehicles, 1 on the street, 1 in a freight yard, 1 at a building entrance, and 1 in a park. Among the 10 “other” deaths, 2 were found on roof landings, 2 in a friend’s apartment, 2 in abandoned buildings, 1 in a building stairwell, 1 on a stairwell landing, 1 in a hallway, and 1 jumped from a roof.

All 15 of the HRA-reported homeless persons’ deaths were residents of SRO housing and as such defined as sheltered, when they died. Four were reported as dying in the hospital, 6 in an HRA emergency housing facility (shelter), and 5 in unknown locations (Table 4).

Deaths reported by OCME, DHS and HPD cannot be added to deaths reported by HRA. As stated above, HRA-reported homeless decedents may not be identified by law and may duplicate reports from OCME.

Homeless Decedents' Age and Gender by Borough and Community District

Of the 45 OCME, DHS and HPD deaths, 40 (89%) were male and 5 (11%) were female (Table 5). One (2%, male) was an infant, 1 month of age. The infant was a sheltered resident and the death was investigated by OCME.

One (2%, male) was between the ages of 1 and 24 years. Sixteen (36%, 14 male and 2 female) were between the ages of 25 and 44 years. Another 24 (53%, 21 male and 3 female) were between the ages of 45 and 64 years, and 3 (7%, all male) were 65 years of age or older.

Of the 15 HRA homeless decedents, 11 (73%) were male and 4 (27%) were female. Fourteen were between 25 and 64 years of age, and 1 was older than 65 years of age. The age and gender distribution by borough is shown in Table 6.

Comments

The percent of decedents sheltered in this (29%) and the prior quarter (34%) was lower than all previous quarters and was the lowest since the report's initiation. The proportion sheltered has fluctuated over time, with the highest proportion of 86% occurring in the 3rd quarter of reporting. Agency investigation and future reports will help determine whether this recent decline reflects a true trend.

HRA homeless sheltered deaths are reported separately and should not be added to other homeless sheltered deaths as there may be duplication. To comply with Article 27-F of the New York state Public Health Law which prohibits disclosure of any information that could reasonably identify someone having an HIV related illness or AIDS, personal identifiers on HRA homeless deaths were not provided; hence corresponding death certificates could not be reviewed to determine whether deaths were also reported by OCME.
