The Family Preservation Program (FPP) is an intensive, home-based preventive service provided by the Division of Child Protection of the Administration for Children’s Services.

FPP is a six to eight week intervention designed to keep families safely together. Through a program of intensive counseling and support services, FPP works with the family in preventing the removal and placement of children into foster care. The services are provided in the home. The goal is to stabilize the family by removing the risk of harm to the children, rather than taking them into protective custody.

FPP is a voluntary program. Families are referred to FPP by their local ACS field office Staff trained in a culturally sensitive approach to working with clients assist families in developing effective problem-solving skills and act as advocates for the families to help them take advantage of services in their communities and learn how to access help in the future. A sample of the broad spectrum of FPP services are:

- Crisis intervention
- Intensive casework
- Individual, group and family counseling
- Child abuse prevention
- Information & referral

FPP currently serves 15 areas throughout the five boroughs. There are four sites each in the Bronx, Manhattan and Brooklyn, two in Queens and one in Staten Island.

The Family Mentor Program is a support service unique to FPP. Family Mentors are residents of the communities served by FPP as well as other concerned citizens who serve as role models for families. The Family Mentors share their life skills, knowledge and accrued wisdom in a variety of areas, including their own experience as parents. Family Mentors can be assigned to the family for up to 10 months following the initial intervention, and provide continued support long after the intensive service period ends.

The Family & Community Advocate component is also unique to FPP. Each site has a person who is responsible for developing linkages with local service providers, religious institutions, businesses, social clubs, etc. that have the potential to positively influence the lives of families. The goal is to better service the families referred to the Family Preservation Program.
