

Quarterly Report on Homeless Deaths # 15
New York City Department of Health and Mental Hygiene
Bureau of Vital Statistics
Local Law 63 of 2005
January 1, 2009 – March 31, 2009

Introduction. This report has been prepared and submitted pursuant to Local Law 63 of 2005 (LL63) amending the Administrative Code of the City of New York to track and report deaths of homeless persons in the City of New York. Data contained in this report are for the quarter period of January 1, 2009 – March 31, 2009 and were provided by the NYC Office of Chief Medical Examiner (OCME), the NYC Department of Homeless Services (DHS), the NYC Department of Housing Preservation and Development (HPD) and the NYC Human Resources Administration (HRA) to the NYC Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (DOHMH).

DHS, HPD and HRA maintain records on the homeless individuals for whom they provide temporary housing in New York City. OCME, through its responsibilities investigating New York City deaths, investigates the deaths of some homeless individuals. Data from these agencies were compiled, matched against NYC death certificates and analyzed by the DOHMH Office of Vital Statistics and are presented herein.


Definitions. As defined in LL63, a “homeless person” is a person who at the time of death did not have a known street address of a residence at which he or she was known or reasonably believed to have resided. A “homeless shelter resident” is “a person who at the time of death lived in a homeless shelter. A “homeless shelter” is “(i) a residence operated by or on behalf of the Department of Homeless Services; (ii) an emergency residence operated by or on behalf of the Department of Social Services/Human Resources administration which is available primarily for homeless persons with HIV or AIDS related illness; or (iii) a residence operated by or on behalf of the Department of Housing Preservation and Development to the extent that such residence houses clients of the Department of Homeless Services; provided, however that such term shall not include any residence that is available primarily for battered women.”

Methods. Based on definitions above, incident reports were provided by OCME, DHS and HPD. Information from corresponding NYC death certificates were used to validate agency reports and remove any duplicates among them (i.e. when DHS cases are also OCME cases). HRA did not disclose any identifiable information on HRA homeless residents, per Article 27-F of the New York State Public Health Law, which prohibits disclosure of information that could reasonably identify someone as having an HIV-related illness or AIDS. As a result, HRA homeless deaths cannot be combined with DHS, HPD and OCME deaths and total NYC homeless deaths cannot be ascertained.

DEATHS OF HOMELESS PERSONS AND HOMELESS SHELTER RESIDENTS

Reported Homeless Deaths

The trend chart below displays deaths over all 15 quarters. First, second and third annual reports include final data for quarters 1-4, 5-8 and 9-12 respectively. The data for quarters 13-15 are preliminary, and may change with late reporting. These changes will be reflected in the annual report.



FINDINGS FROM PREVIOUS REPORTS

Last Quarter (Oct-Dec '08)

- There were 47 DHS, HPD and OCME deaths last quarter.
- HRA reported 14 deaths during the last quarter

Previous 14 Quarters

- On average, 40 deaths have been reported per quarter by DHS, HPD and OCME.
 - The number per quarter have ranged from 22 to 61.
- On average, there have been 21 non-sheltered decedents and 19 sheltered decedents per quarter. One decedent was reported as having an unknown shelter status.
- On average, there have been 19 deaths in hospitals, 6 deaths in shelters, 9 deaths outdoors and 7 deaths in "other" locations per quarter.

OVERALL FINDINGS

41 OCME, DHS AND HPD HOMELESS DEATHS

- 41 homeless deaths, reported by OCME, DHS and HPD occurred between January 1 and March 31 (Table 1).
 - 19 (46%) occurred in Manhattan, 9 (22%) in the Bronx, 6 (15%) in Brooklyn, 7 (17%) in Queens, and none in Staten Island.

- 39 (95%) were investigated by OCME (Table 1).
- 33 (80%) were male and 8 (20%) were female (Table 5). Two (5%, 1 male and 1 female) were infants, under 1 year of age. Both infants were shelter residents and were investigated by OCME.
- 27 (66%) were deaths to non-sheltered homeless individuals (Table 1).
- 14 (34%) were death to sheltered homeless individuals (Table 1).

27 Non-Sheltered Homeless Deaths

27 (66%) NYC homeless deaths among non-sheltered (Table 1)

- 12 (44%) died in Manhattan, 4 (15%) in the Bronx, 5 (19%) in Brooklyn, 6 (22%) in Queens, and none in Staten Island.
- 26 (96%) of the 27 non-sheltered were investigated by OCME.
- 26 (66%) of 39 OCME investigated were non-sheltered.

Location of 27 Non-Sheltered Homeless Deaths (Table 3)

- 14 (52%) died in a hospital.
- 3 (11%) died outdoors.
 - 1 was found in an abandoned vehicle.
 - 1 was found in a vacant lot.
 - 1 was found in an expressway.
- 10 (37%) died in “other” locations.
 - 5 were found on a subway platform or in a train station.
 - 5 were found in a public space in a building.

14 Sheltered Homeless Deaths

14 (34%) NYC homeless deaths occurred among sheltered

- 7 (50%) died in Manhattan, 5 (36%) in the Bronx, 1 (7%) in Brooklyn, 1 (7%) in Queens and none in Staten Island. (Table 1)
- 13 (93%) of 14 sheltered homeless were investigated by OCME (Table 1).
- 13 (33%) of the 39 OCME investigated deaths were sheltered decedents (Table 1).
- 2 (14%, 1 males and 1 female) sheltered homeless deaths were infants, under 1 year of age (Table 5).

Location of Shelters Among Homeless Deaths (Table 2)

- 6 (43%) in Manhattan
- 5 (36%) in the Bronx
- 2 (14%) in Brooklyn
- 1 (7%) in Queens
- None in Staten Island

Location of Sheltered Homeless Deaths (Table 3)

- 8 (57%) died in the hospital.
- 5 (36%) died at the homeless shelter.
- 1 (7%) died outdoors on an expressway.
- None died in an “other” location (Table 3).

12 HRA HOMELESS DEATHS

- 12 homeless deaths were reported by HRA. As indicated in the methods section, HRA homeless deaths cannot be combined with DHS, HPD and OCME deaths and total NYC homeless deaths cannot be ascertained. are reported separately
- 8 (67%) were reported to have occurred in Manhattan, 2 (17%) in the Bronx, 1 (8%) in Brooklyn, 1 (8%) in Queens, and none in Staten Island.
- All 12 of the HRA-reported homeless persons’ deaths were residents of SRO housing and as such defined as sheltered, when they died. Six were reported as dying in the hospital, and the other 6 in an HRA emergency housing facility (shelter)(Table 4).
- 8 (67%) were male and 4 (33%) were female. One (8%, female) was between the ages of 25 and 44 years old. 10 (83%, 7 male and 3 female) were between the ages 45 and 64. One (8%, male) was over the age of 65. The age and gender distribution by borough is shown in Table 6.

SROs are not considered homeless shelters by HRA, but they are included in this report because they are homeless shelter residents according to Local Law No. 63 of 2005 (codified at New York City Administrative Code Section 17-190) definitions #2 Homeless shelter resident and #3 Homeless shelter were classified as homeless sheltered residents. HRA homeless sheltered deaths are reported separately and should not be added to other homeless sheltered deaths as there may be duplication. To comply with Article 27-F of the New York state Public Health Law which prohibits disclosure of any information that could reasonably identify someone having an HIV related illness or AIDS, personal identifiers on HRA homeless deaths were not provided; hence corresponding death certificates could not be reviewed to determine whether deaths were also reported by OCME.
