

Quarterly Report on Homeless Deaths # 23
New York City Department of Health and Mental Hygiene
Bureau of Vital Statistics
Local Law 63 of 2005
January 1, 2011 – March 31, 2011

Introduction. This report has been prepared and submitted pursuant to Local Law 63 of 2005 (LL63) amending the Administrative Code of the City of New York to track and report deaths of homeless persons in the City of New York. Data contained in this report are for the quarter period of January 1, 2011 – March 31, 2011 and were provided by the NYC Office of Chief Medical Examiner (OCME), the NYC Department of Homeless Services (DHS), the NYC Department of Housing Preservation and Development (HPD), and the NYC Human Resources Administration (HRA) to the NYC Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (DOHMH).

DHS, HPD, and HRA maintain records on the homeless individuals for whom they provide temporary housing in New York City. OCME, through its responsibilities investigating New York City deaths, investigates the deaths of some homeless individuals. Data from these agencies were compiled, matched against NYC death certificates and analyzed by the DOHMH Office of Vital Statistics and are presented herein.


Definitions. As defined in LL63, a “homeless person” is a person who at the time of death did not have a known street address of a residence at which he or she was known or reasonably believed to have resided. A “homeless shelter resident” is “a person who at the time of death lived in a homeless shelter. A “homeless shelter” is “(i) a residence operated by or on behalf of the Department of Homeless Services; (ii) an emergency residence operated by or on behalf of the Department of Social Services/Human Resources administration which is available primarily for homeless persons with HIV or AIDS related illness; or (iii) a residence operated by or on behalf of the Department of Housing Preservation and Development to the extent that such residence houses clients of the Department of Homeless Services; provided, however that such term shall not include any residence that is available primarily for battered women.”

Methods. Based on definitions above, incident reports were provided by DHS, HPD, and OCME. Information from corresponding NYC death certificates were used to validate agency reports and remove any duplicates among them (i.e. when DHS cases are also OCME cases). HRA did not disclose any identifiable information on HRA homeless residents, per Article 27-F of the New York State Public Health Law, which prohibits disclosure of information that could reasonably identify someone as having an HIV-related illness or AIDS. As a result, HRA homeless deaths cannot be combined with DHS, HPD, and OCME deaths and total NYC homeless deaths cannot be ascertained.

DEATHS OF HOMELESS PERSONS
Reported Homeless Deaths

The trend chart below displays deaths over the past 23 reporting quarters. First, second, third, fourth, and fifth annual reports include final data for quarters 1-4, 5-8, 9-12, 13-16, and 17-20 respectively. The data for the 21st – 23rd quarters are preliminary, and may change with late reporting. These changes will be reflected in the sixth annual report.

FINDINGS FROM PREVIOUS REPORTS[†]

Previous 22 Quarters

- On average, 42 deaths have been reported per quarter by DHS, HPD, and OCME.
- The number per quarter has ranged from 22 to 61.
- On average per quarter, 54% of deaths reported were among non-sheltered decedents and 46% were among sheltered decedents.
- On average per quarter, 48% of deaths occurred in hospitals, 21% occurred outdoors*, 14% occurred in homeless shelters, and 16% occurred in other locations.

OVERALL FINDINGS FOR THE CURRENT (23rd) QUARTER (January - March '11) †

37 DHS, HPD, AND OCME HOMELESS DEATHS (Table 2)

- 37 homeless deaths, reported by DHS, HPD, and OCME occurred between January 1 and March 31.
 - 20 (54%) occurred in Manhattan, 2 (5%) in the Bronx, 11 (30%) in Brooklyn, 4 (11%) in Queens, and none in Staten Island.
 - 17 (46%) were deaths to non-sheltered homeless individuals.
 - 20 (54%) were death to sheltered homeless individuals.
- 28 (76%) were investigated by OCME‡, which investigates persons who die in a suspicious or unusual manner, alone, in apparent good health, in a correctional facility, and from criminal violence or suicide. - 27 (73%) were male and 10 (27%) were female (Table 3).
 - 1 (3%, male) was under 1 year of age.
 - 2 (5%, 1 male, 1 female) were between the ages of 1 and 24.
 - 11 (30%, 7 male, 4 female) were between the ages of 25 and 44.
 - 21 (57%, 17 male, 4 female) were between the ages of 45 and 64.
 - 2 (5%, 1 male, 1 female) were 65 years old or over.
- 23 (62%) deaths occurred in hospitals, 9 (24%) occurred in other locations, 3 (8%) occurred in homeless shelters, and 2 (5%) occurred outdoors.

17 Homeless Deaths among Non-sheltered Individuals

17 (46%) NYC homeless deaths occurred among non-sheltered (Table 2)

- 9 (53%) died in Manhattan, 1 (6%) in the Bronx, 4 (24%) in Brooklyn, 3 (18%) in Queens, and none in Staten Island.
- 16 (94%) of the 17 homeless deaths among non-sheltered individuals were investigated by OCME.

Location of 17 Homeless Deaths among Non-sheltered Individuals (Table 4)

- 8 (47%) died in hospitals.
- 7 (41%) died in "other" locations.
 - 1 was found in a public space in a public building.
 - 1 was found in an abandoned building.
 - 2 were found in a family or friend's apartment.
 - 3 were found in subway stations or on subway trains.
- 2 (12%) died outdoors.
 - 1 was found near an expressway.
 - 1 was found on the sidewalk.

†All percentages were rounded to the nearest whole number.

‡The definition of "investigated by OCME" has changed, starting with the data included in the 5th Annual Report (Quarters 17- 20) and the 21st Quarterly Report. This category includes only homeless deaths that were fully investigated by the OCME and resulted in an investigation report. Currently, this category no longer includes cases that the OCME reviewed and declined jurisdiction (claim-only cases) or cases that OCME reviewed for cremation clearance.

20 Homeless Deaths among Sheltered Individuals

20 (54%) NYC homeless deaths occurred among sheltered (Table 2)

- 11 (55%) died in Manhattan, 1 (5%) in the Bronx, 7 (35%) in Brooklyn, 1 (5%) in Queens, and none in Staten Island.
- 12 (60%) of the 20 homeless deaths among sheltered individuals were investigated by OCME.

Location of 20 Homeless Deaths among Sheltered Individuals (Table 4)

- 15 (75%) died in hospitals.
- 3 (15%) died in homeless shelters.
- 2 (10%) died in “other” locations.
 - 1 was found on subway tracks.
 - 1 was found at a place of employment.

Location of Shelters among 20 Sheltered Individuals (Table 5)

- 9 (45%) in Manhattan
- 2 (10%) in the Bronx
- 8 (40%) in Brooklyn
- 1 (5%) in Queens
- None in Staten Island

9 HRA HOMELESS DEATHS (Table 6)

- 9 homeless deaths were reported by HRA. As indicated in the methods section, HRA homeless deaths cannot be combined with DHS, HPD and OCME deaths.
- All 9 of the HRA-reported homeless persons’ deaths were residents of SRO housing and therefore are defined as sheltered when they died.
- 7 (78%) were reported to have died in Manhattan, 1 (11%) in the Bronx, 1 (11%) in Queens, and none died in Brooklyn or Staten Island.
- 8 (89%) were reported as dying in HRA emergency housing facilities (shelters), and 1 (11%) died in a hospital.
- 6 (67%) were male and 3 (33%) were female. 2 (22%) were between the ages of 25 and 44, and 7 (78%) were between the ages of 45 and 64 (Table 7).

HRA homeless sheltered deaths are reported separately and should not be added to other homeless sheltered deaths as there may be duplication. To comply with Article 27-F of the New York state Public Health Law which prohibits disclosure of any information that could reasonably identify someone having an HIV related illness or AIDS, personal identifiers on HRA homeless deaths were not provided; hence corresponding death certificates could not be reviewed to determine whether deaths were also reported by OCME.
