# COMMISSION ON HUMAN RIGHTS

## HUMAN RIGHTS LAW

The NYC Commission on Human Rights enforces the NYC Human Rights Law, which prohibits discrimination in employment, housing, and public accommodations based on race, color, creed, age, national origin, alienage or citizenship status, gender (including gender identity and sexual harassment), sexual orientation, disability, marital status, and partnership status.

In addition, the Law affords protection against discrimination in employment based on arrest or conviction record and status as a victim of domestic violence, stalking and sex offenses.

In housing, the Law affords additional protections based on lawful occupation, family status, and lawful source of income. The Law also prohibits retaliation and bias-related harassment, (including cyberbullying).
