SCHOOL PROGRAM

Designed for middle, high school and college students, the school program includes three workshops: the **New York City Human Rights Law, Sexual Harassment** and **Resolving Conflict**. Each workshop includes an overview of how the law applies to the areas of employment, housing, and public accommodations and the various protected classes (e.g. race, religion, gender, or national origin). The workshops range from three to six sessions. The Commission also offers a 10 session Peer Mediation training program for middle and high school students.

HUMAN RIGHTS LAW, DIVERSITY, CULTURAL SENSITIVITY, AND HUMAN DIGNITY

- Introduction to the NYC Human Rights Law.
- Case studies that apply an understanding of the law.
- Types of bias-related harassment.

SEXUAL HARASSMENT

- Practical and realistic suggestions for recognizing and handling the unwelcome conduct, including sexual harassment online.
- Video materials and discussions to clarify harassing situations and demonstrate appropriate responses tailored to the age level of the students.

RESOLVING CONFLICT

- Nonviolent alternatives in conflict situations.
- Problem solving techniques.
- Cyberbullying.
