You will need to bring several documents to your first meeting with your Housing Recovery Specialist, including material about your identity. In order to confirm your identity, you must provide your driver's license, passport, permanent resident card or military ID.

If you want to replace your driver's license, there are two possible methods:

1. Apply online
2. Apply by mail

Apply online

- Log into the E-Filing website at <https://efiling.uscis.dhs.gov/efile>
- Fill out form I-90: Application to Replace Permanent Residence Card on the website
 - ▶ You will need to include basic information about yourself, your immigration history, and the reason for replacing your card.
- Pay the fee of \$450
 - ▶ If paying by check or money order, make payable to the Department of Homeland Security

Apply by mail

- Download and fill out form I-90: Application to Replace Permanent Residence Card (available at <http://iafdb.travel.state.gov>)
 - ▶ You will need to include basic information about yourself, your immigration history, and the reason for replacing your card.

- Pay the fee of \$450
 - ▶ If paying by check or money order, make payable to the Department of Homeland Security.

 - ▶ If using USPS Express Mail or a Courier, send to:

If you apply by mail, you can choose to fill out form G-1145: E-Notification of Application/Petition Acceptance (available at <http://www.uscis.gov/files/form/g-1145.pdf>). This form is not required, but allows you to be electronically notified when your application is accepted.
