You will need to bring several documents to your first meeting with your Housing Recovery Specialist, including material about your identity. In order to confirm your identity, you must provide your driver's license, passport, permanent resident card, or military ID.

If you are a military retiree or are currently in the military and your military ID was lost or damaged in the storm, you will need to replace it. You will need to gather **other forms of identification** before you can secure a replacement military identification card:

- A photo ID** issued by a state or federal agency, such as a driver's license. For more information on how to replace a license, see Document #3.
- A document commonly known as a secondary form of identification, such as a birth certificate or a Social Security number card. For information about how to replace these, see Documents #11 and #12.

Then, do the following:

- Find a **RAPIDS** (Real Time Automated Personnel Identification System) Office
 - ▶ In New York City, RAPIDS has an office at Fort Hamilton in Brooklyn at:

The ID office is open **Monday - Thursday: 8 AM to 12 PM and 1 PM to 4 PM.;**
Friday from 10 AM to 12 PM and 1 PM to 4 PM.
