### **Founding Executive Director, Food Service Industry Partnership Workforce Development Division**

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#### **Agency Description:**

The New York City Department of Small Business Services (SBS) is a dynamic, client-centered agency whose mission is to serve New York's small businesses, jobseekers and commercial districts. SBS makes it easier for companies in New York City to start, operate, and expand by providing direct assistance to business owners, supporting commercial districts, promoting financial and economic opportunity among minority- and women-owned businesses, preparing New Yorkers for jobs, and linking employers with a skilled and qualified workforce. SBS continues to reach for higher professional standards through innovative systems, new approaches to government, and a strong focus on its employees.

#### **Workforce Development Division**

The Workforce Development Division is dedicated to improving the economic mobility of all New Yorkers through the delivery of quality employment and training services. The first recommendation of Mayor de Blasio's workforce development strategy, *Career Pathways: One City, Working Together*, is expanding Industry Partnerships to ensure that New York City businesses are able to find the talent needed to thrive and grow and New Yorkers are equipped with the skills and qualifications needed to access jobs with family sustaining wages. Industry Partnerships are intermediaries between industry, government, organized labor, academia, philanthropy, community-based organizations and training providers that work together to drive the economic vitality of NYC through the development of a superior talent pool that is inclusive of all New Yorkers.

#### **Job Description:**

We are seeking an experienced senior professional to lead the City's strategy and investments in developing a Food Service Industry Partnership in NYC. The scope of this Industry Partnership includes full-service restaurants, limited service restaurants, caterers, and related industries. The Founding Executive Director of the Food Service Industry Partnership is a public facing role, with responsibility for fulfilling the Mayor's vision of workforce development in the food service sector. S/he will work closely with the Mayor's Office of Workforce Development to ensure the city's \$500 million investment in workforce development is informed by and meets the needs of industry. S/he will be responsible for liaising with employers, food service employer associations and trade groups, training providers, and workforce partners to build a sustainable and robust pipeline of local talent to fill New York City's food service jobs.

The Food Service Industry Partnership will:

- design innovative training models that address labor shortages in the market;
- ensure training is informed by employer demand by building real-time feedback loops between industry and training providers/education systems;
- develop strategies to increase advancement opportunities for food service workers;
- devise methods of increasing profitability of food service businesses by improving employee retention and productivity;
- foster collaboration between workforce organizations active in this sector to catalyze systems change by building capacity, supporting scale for effective interventions, and creating educational frameworks to link trainings across providers;
- build adaptive capacity by creating and implementing a strategy for long-term sustainable engagement between and among employers, workforce leaders and funders.

**Specific Responsibilities:**

- Lead the development of the City's strategy for investing in food service training, internships/work-based learning, and other projects that foster workforce development in the food service sector in New York City
- Work closely with employers, employer associations, and other stakeholders to understand hiring/talent needs, and determine the most appropriate vehicle for meeting them with NYC residents
- In partnership with employers, employer associations, and other stakeholders develop methods of improving the profitability of food service employers by improving retention and productivity of workers including compensation and benefits review, scheduling, and training standards
- Develop innovative strategies for upgrading the skills of current food service workers particularly young adults and foreign-born New Yorkers
- Serve as a source of information and assistance to employers, business organizations, and community partners with respect to the food service sector in New York City and related development, education, training, and employment activities
- Represent the City of New York in meetings/events/presentations with corporate partners, City Hall, City Council, City Agencies and other stakeholders
- Successfully direct and supervise personnel
- Lead and participate in special projects as needed
- Work closely with Mayor's Office of Workforce Development and other City Agencies to direct the City's investments in workforce development in the food service sector.

**Preferred Skills:**

- Senior level professional with 8 plus years of experience in the food service sector.
- Extensive knowledge of industry with established network of contacts.
- Excellent analytical and creative problem-solving skills.
- Experience managing multiple stakeholders and staff.
- Knowledge of adult learning best practices and occupational skills training.
- Outstanding written and verbal communications skills, including formal presentation skills.
- Ability to effectively and confidently present to senior level public and corporate officials.
- Comfortable working in a fast-paced environment, managing multiple projects simultaneously and prioritizing projects to meet deadlines.
- Entrepreneurial and collaborative style that works well in teams.
- Knowledge of NYC labor market.

**Qualifications:**

1. A baccalaureate degree from an accredited college and 5 years of full-time paid experience acquired within the last fifteen years, of advisory or administrative experience including handling of business promotion or economic problems, at least 2 years of which must have been in a managerial or executive capacity with primary focus on business promotion or urban economic planning.
