#### CITY AWAITS IMPACT OF FUNDING REDUCTIONS

In December, President Bush signed the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2008, a spending bill that contained a \$250 million rescission of prior year WIA funds and a 1.7% reduction to the Program Year 2008 WIA formula allocation. New York City funds at risk for rescission had been intended to support new initiatives. As such, SBS projects that the funding reductions will result in the inability to launch new initiatives rather than cuts to existing programs. Once federal and state officials clarify the impact of the funding reductions, WIB staff will provide an update to members.

#### NYC BUSINESS SOLUTIONS TRAINING AWARDS NEARLY \$1,000,000

On December 17th, SBS awarded seven businesses a total of \$995,125 in NYC Business Solutions Training Funds, the business-driven training grant program allowing employers to develop customized training programs to increase the skills and advancement opportunities for their employees. The projects selected will provide occupational training for 877 employees in NYC firms, including 135 new hires. Ninety-nine percent of trainees are expected to earn wage gains.

#### NYC LABOR MARKET INFORMATION SERVICE HIRES NEW RESEARCH DIRECTOR

After an intensive interview process, the WIB and CUNY selected Ms. Lesley Hirsch as the Research Director for the NYC Labor Market Information Service (LMIS) in January 2008. Lesley has over 15 years of experience serving in technical, management and advisory capacities on evaluation and research projects. We are excited to introduce Lesley and provide an in-depth overview of the LMIS at the next Quarterly Meeting on March 12th.


