Provides no-cost healthcare services, including primary care, specialty referrals, counseling, and patient education; prescription drugs at a significantly reduced cost; and free crucial social services, such as screening and registration for government health insurance and entrance into job placement and training programs.

Brooklyn Free Clinic

A student-run organization that provides free healthcare to the uninsured in Brooklyn. Under the guidance of volunteer physicians and faculty advisors, students help provide care and health maintenance screening to patients and make referral to a network of specialists who have volunteered to treat patients for free. - Food Program Locator: Find a soup kitchen, food pantry, senior center, afterschool and summer programs, low-income daycare centers, Open Market BackPack programs for children, shelters, rehabilitation centers and youth programs citywide.
- Summer Meals: The Food Bank works with the NYC Dep't. of Education to make sure children have access to the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) to replace the free and reduced-price school meals received during the school year.
- Food Stamps: The federal Food Stamp Program is a simple, dependable way to buy food.
- Free Income Tax Services: Last year, the Food Bank For NYC helped get New Yorkers more than \$60 million they were owed in tax refunds and credits.
