TLC FREE EMERGENCY TRANSPORTATION PROVIDED BY INDUSTRY VOLUNTEERS

At the request of the New York Taxi and Limousine Commission (TLC), the industries regulated by the TLC, including the medallion taxicab, livery vehicle, black car, commuter van and paratransit industries, have come forward to offer free emergency transportation during the World Trade Center crisis. The transportation will operate as follows:

- Temporary taxi stands will be installed at the Manhattan hospitals and Blood Bank locations attached, until further notice.
- Industry members wishing to provide service may report to the designated site(s) of their choice.
- Signs will be installed by New York City Department of Transportation to identify the locations.
- Sites will be staffed by TLC Enforcement personnel accompanied by a marked TLC vehicle.
- TLC-licensed drivers of medallion taxicabs, livery vehicles, black cars, commuter vans and paratransit vehicles will enter the stands on a first-come first served basis and proceed to the front of the line to be dispatched by a TLC Enforcement Officer.
- Upon dispatch, the TLC Enforcement Officer will provide each passenger with a receipt stating the plate or medallion number, date and time, and a telephone number where the TLC may be reached if the passenger wishes.
- Depending upon need and dispatcher discretion, shared rides may be arranged.
- Passengers will be taken from point to point to destinations of their choice within Manhattan. Service outside Manhattan may be added at another time. However, some drivers may now opt to transport passengers outside Manhattan on a discretionary basis.
- Hours of Operation:
 Effective September 13, 2001, beginning 6:00 p.m., and until further notice. Hours of operation are: as needed, as determined by the TLC.
