### SHORT HAUL AREA ENLARGED FOR TAXICAB TRIPS FROM JOHN F. KENNEDY INTL. AIRPORT

The New York City Taxi and Limousine Commission (TLC) is pleased to share with you the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey's announcement that the existing Short-Haul Area originating at John F. Kennedy International Airport has been enlarged to encompass any destination in Brooklyn or Queens.

The announcement also included a name change. The "JFK Quick Return Ticket" will replace the "Short-Haul" or "Shorty" ticket. The JFK Quick Return Ticket will be issued to all taxicab drivers taking a fare from any JFK terminal to any destination in Queens or Brooklyn, regardless of its distance from the airport.

The JFK Quick Return Ticket works exactly like the Short-Haul ticket it replaces. Once you drop off your passenger, you may return to JFK Airport within 90 minutes and be allowed onto the Quick Return line in the Central Taxi Hold.
