I am Councilmember Larry Seabrook,
Chair of the New York City Council Civil
Rights Committee and City Councilmember for
the District 12 in the Bronx.

For the last 35 years I have dedicated myself to advocating for the needs of my community. And for the past 25 years, I have been committed to my duties as an elected official in the New York State Assembly, the New York State Senate, and for the past eight years, the New York City Council.

During my time in the City Council, I have delivered over \$51 million in capital budget allocations to schools, youth and community programs, housing developments and senior centers - \$51 million that will help ensure that our students get the best education, that our working families have a comfortable place to call home, and our senior citizens have access to the programs
