Spotlight on... Ban the Box

In October 2012, the Young Men's Initiative partnered with the Human Services Council of New York and the Fortune Society to host special forums educating human service providers about Executive Order 151: Ban the Box

WHAT'S GOING ON:

On August 4th, 2011, Mayor Michael R. Bloomberg issued Executive Order 151 instructing all City agencies to remove questions about criminal history from their job application forms and to refrain from asking the question during any job applicant's first interview. The Mayor has since extended the language of this order to the City's standard human service provider contract. So in October 2012, the Young Men's Initiative, the Fortune Society and the Human Services Council of New York hosted a series of forums for providers on learning how to "Ban the Box."
