

NATIVE NEW YORKER, SACRAMENTO KINGS PLAYER, MOE HARKLESS, DONATES TO YOUNG PEOPLE IN NYC WHO HAVE BEEN IN THE FOSTER CARE SYSTEM

IN PARTNERSHIP WITH NEW YORKERS FOR CHILDREN & ACS, HARKLESS' GENEROUS DONATION WILL PROVIDE EXTRA FINANCIAL SUPPORT TO OLDER YOUTH WHO HAVE TRANSITIONED FROM FOSTER CARE

January 14, 2022 – Today, Sacramento Kings Player and Queens, NY native, Moe Harkless, donated to the Last Resort Emergency Response Fund managed by New Yorkers For Children in partnership with the NYC Administration for Children's Services (ACS) for the second year in a row. The donation will provide emergency financial support to older youth who have had experience in the foster care system, and who were impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. For instance, funds will be used to assist with college tuition, laptops for school, transportation costs, medical bills, and more.

The Mayor's Fund to Advance New York City, in addition to facilitating this donation, has contributed to the Last Resort Emergency Response Fund to support families and young people across all five boroughs.

"New Yorkers For Children is so grateful to Mr. Harkless for his generous gift again this year! This funding provides essential support, via our Last Resort Emergency Response Fund, to youth who have transitioned from the foster care system. Hardships created by COVID-19 are evident not just in the total number of youth this fund has already served, but in the nature of the requests for funding. COVID-19 has merely exacerbated an already-existing crisis such as housing instability and food insecurity and this generous grant from Moe Harkless comes at just the right time. Moe Harkless, a Puerto Rican, Jamaica Queens native and NBA star for the Sacramento Kings is an art collector, wine enthusiast, fashion + culture trendsetter, and social justice advocate. Not only is he an NBA star whose passions include art & creativity, but in the wake of Covid-19 and George Floyd he is channeling his own creativity and utilizing his access to a wide audience of fans to launch an IG live quarantine show in partnership with Uninterrupted hosting "Wine Wednesdays" with other wine enthusiasts such as Amar'e Stoudemire and Sommelier Devin Reed, and has thrown his support behind black social justice initiatives and causes by launching his own black social impact resource platform 'Black Lives Now' with information on Black Owned Businesses in NYC and LA, Black Mental Health programs, Voting information, organizations and other interactive ways people can help the black community, Black owned restaurants, Black owned wine companies, books written by Black authors, Black music, Black contemporary artists and more. New Yorkers For Children and the NYC Administration for Children's Services established the COVID-19 Emergency Response Fund in March 2020 to address urgent needs arising from the COVID-19 pandemic among children and families involved with ACS. The Fund's strategic partnership with philanthropy and individuals has helped raise and disperse over \$1.5 million in support of vulnerable children and families to ensure they have received the critical support needed to stay afloat in the face of the COVID-19 challenge. To date, the fund has reached over 3,285 individuals and families since April; with nearly \$500,000 in direct cash support going to nearly 1,000 families in need and older youth in foster care.
