<sup>1</sup> Physical restraints refer to physical hold techniques included in the Safe Crisis Management System and other non-offensive physical safety interventions. Physical restraints are reported at the incident level; one incident may involve multiple youth restrained.

<sup>2</sup> Injury is defined as any event requiring medical treatment. Injuries range in severity from simple abrasions to broken bones and fractures.

<sup>3</sup> Use of Force- A is a classification used to describe Use of Force Incidents that require medical treatment beyond the prescription of over-the-counter analgesics or the administration of minor first aid

<sup>4</sup> Use of Force B is a classification used to describe Use of Force Incidents that: (1) Do not require hospitalization or medical treatment beyond the prescription of over-the-counter analgesics or the administration of minor first aid (e.g., Use of Force Incidents that result in a superficial bruise, scrape, scratch, or minor swelling); or 2. Involve the forcible use of mechanical restraints in a confrontational situation that results in minor injury

<sup>5</sup> Mechanical restraints refer to restraints involving the use of handcuffs, shackles, and flex-cuffs.

<sup>6</sup> 'Injury A' includes injuries requiring clinical treatment beyond what could be provided by a layperson with over-the-counter products.

<sup>7</sup> 'Injury B' includes injuries treatable by a layperson with over-the-counter products such as ibuprofen, antibiotic ointment, etc. Categorization is
