<sup>1</sup> Estimated available slots = program contract capacity minus active cases, and minus referrals pending for 10 days or less. "Advocates" cases during initial engagement phase may not be captured in the system of record nor fully accounted for in these data.

<sup>2</sup> Includes families and children who were reunified when preventive services were active or for who whom a new preventive case was opened within 60 days after reunification.

<sup>3</sup> Excludes Close to Home placements.
