² Injury is defined as any event requiring medical treatment. Injuries range in severity from simple abrasions to broken bones and fractures.

³ Use of Force- A is a classification used to describe Use of Force Incidents that require medical treatment beyond the prescription of over-the-counter analgesics or the administration of minor first aid

⁴ Use of Force B is a classification used to describe Use of Force Incidents that: (1) Do not require hospitalization or medical treatment beyond the prescription of over-the-counter analgesics or the administration of minor first aid (e.g., Use of Force Incidents that result in a superficial bruise, scrape, scratch, or minor swelling); or 2. Involve the forcible use of mechanical restraints in a confrontational situation that results in minor injury

⁵ Mechanical restraints refer to restraints involving the use of handcuffs, shackles, and flex-cuffs.

⁶ 'Injury A' includes injuries requiring clinical treatment beyond what could be provided by a layperson with over-the-counter products.

⁷ 'Injury B' includes injuries treatable by a layperson with over-the-counter products such as ibuprofen, antibiotic ointment, etc. Categorization is
