<sup>3</sup> 'Injury A' includes injuries requiring clinical treatment beyond what could be provided by a layperson with over-the-counter products. Categorization is made by medical staff.

<sup>4</sup> 'Injury B' includes injuries treatable by a layperson with over-the-counter products such as ibuprofen, antibiotic ointment, etc. Categorization is made by medical staff.

<sup>5</sup> Mechanical restraints refer to restraints involving the use of handcuffs, shackles, and flex-cuffs.
