Data Notes:

*The data in Table 1 are point-in-time and are reported as of the last day of the reporting quarter for comparison and consistency purposes. This is necessary because some families may have participated in more than one program during a given quarter, and data about families served by FSU or families living in DHS shelter are available only as point-in-time.

¹ Estimated available slots = program contract capacity minus active cases, and minus referrals pending for less than 14 days. Advocates cases during initial engagement phase may not be captured in the system of record nor fully accounted for in these data.

² Includes families and children who were reunified when preventive services were active or for who whom a new preventive case was opened within 60 days after reunification.

³ Excludes Close to Home placements.

⁴ Table 2 includes data for the full 3-month period and is not a subset of Table 1.
