
Children Using Vouchers for Child Care January 2021 – February 2024 (End of Month)


Children Using ACS-Issued Low-Income Child Care Vouchers* January 2021 – February 2024 (End of Month)

SCR Intakes January 2021 – February 2024






Consolidated Investigations January 2021 – February 2024






CARES* Cases January 2021 – February 2024



^{*}CARES (Collaborative Assessment, Response, Engagement and Support, formerly known as FAR) is an alternative Child Protective response to some reports of child maltreatment. CARES does not require an investigation and determination of allegations and individual culpability for families reported to the SCR. It is an alternative approach to providing protection to children by engaging families in an assessment of child safety and of family needs, in finding solutions to family problems and in identifying informal and formal supports to meet their needs and increase their ability to care for their children.






Investigation Indication Rate* January 2020 – December 2023


Percent of Protective Diagnostic Cases (Consolidated Investigations and CARES) with Indicated Investigations* January 2020 – December 2023


Average Child Protection Caseload* December 2022 – February 2023 and December 2023 – February 2024


OSI Family Foster Care and Day Care* Investigations February 2023 – February 2024


Article 10 Filings and Initial Hearing Outcomes, Children CY 2021 – February 2024



New Child Welfare Prevention Cases January 2021 – February 2024






New Child Welfare Prevention Cases by Program Type* February 2023 – February 2024




Average Daily Children's Center Population February 2023 – February 2024






New Placements of Children into Foster Care January 2021 – January 2024




Reason for New Placements of Children into Foster Care January 2023 – January 2024


New Placements of Children into Foster Care* by Age CY 2021 – January 2024




Children Freed for Adoption, Surrender by at Least One Parent January 2023 – January 2024

Permanency and Non-Permanency* Discharges from Foster Care** January 2023 – January 2024





Total Monthly Admissions to Detention January 2021 – February 2024




Detention Monthly Average Daily Population January 2021 – February 2024



Sixteen- and seventeen-year-olds charged with a misdemeanor are also JDs; Juvenile Offender (JO) a person 13-15 years of age with a serious violent felony charge; and Other case type includes youth detained for other authorities and ACS warrants.




Total Monthly Releases from Detention January 2021 – February 2024






Close to Home Admissions January 2021 – February 2024




CTH Placement, in 24-hour Care February 2023 – February 2024 (end of month)





December 2022 – February 2023 and December 2023 – February 2024







Figure 2: SCR Allegations in Investigations

Allegations are grouped as follows: Physical Abuse - burn, fatality, fracture, choking, twisting, shaking, excessive corporal punishment, internal injuries, lacerations, bruises, welts, poisoning, noxious substances; Educational Neglect – educational neglect; Lack of Medical Care – lack of medical care; Other Neglect - inadequate guardianship, inadequate food, clothing, shelter, lack of supervision, malnutrition, failure to thrive, swelling, dislocations, sprains; Psychological Abuse - isolation, emotional neglect; Sexual Abuse/Trafficking – sexual abuse, sex trafficking; Substance Abuse - parental drug use, child drug use; and Other -abandonment, inappropriate custodial conduct, labor trafficking.

December 2022 – February 2023 and December 2023 – February 2024


