What is Female Genital Mutilation/Cutting (FGM/C)?

"Female genital mutilation (FGM) comprises all procedures that involve partial or total removal of the external female genitalia, or other injury to the female genital organs, for <u>non-medical</u> reasons." – World Health Organization, 1997

FGM/C Facts:

- FGM/C is a Human Rights Violation
- FGM/C is a Crime in the United States
- FGM/C performed on a minor is Child Abuse, and must be reported to the SCR*
- FGM/C can not be justified due to cultural, religious, traditional or other beliefs
- FGM/C results in many short and long term physical and psychological consequences:

Physical Consequences May Include:

- Excessive bleeding
- Infection/recurring infections
- Urination difficulties
- Poor wound healing
- Transmission of HIV/Hepatitis
- Sexual dysfunction
- Infertility
- Childbirth complications
- Heavy/painful menses
- Shock
- Death
- Need for additional surgery

Psychological Consequences May Include:

- Depression/Anxiety:
 - Powerless, guilt
 - o Sadness
 - Low self-esteem
 - Body image issues
 - o Betrayal
 - Relationship & family issues
- <u>PTSD:</u>
 - Nightmares
 - Intrusive memories
 - o Severe emotional distress
 - o Trauma triggers
 - Flashbacks
 - o Trauma avoidance
 - o Overwhelming guilt and/or shame

Working with Survivors:

- Only refer to <u>culturally sensitive</u> and <u>clinically informed</u> service providers. (You can email <u>FGM@acs.nyc.gov</u> to ask questions and discuss provider options)
- Avoid the word "mutilation" as it may be offensive to the survivor
 - Mirror the survivor's own language, use their words to discuss FGM/C
- Avoid asking for unnecessary details to prevent re-traumatization
- Notify <u>FGM@acs.nyc.gov</u> for guidance and service provider referrals

Prevention Through Developing and Communicating Awareness of:

- "Vacation Cutting"- a planned summer trip to a country that practices FGM/C, or a holiday trip that requires additional time off from school, and/or mention of visiting relatives for an upcoming "special ceremony"
- FGM/C cannot be justified on either traditional or religious grounds. It may be a traditional practice, but it is not required in any religious text.
- Recognition of the vulnerability of <u>very young</u> girls the younger the girl, the less likely she will understand or object
