Currently, Local Law 145 of 2013, which 18 added section 24-163.11 to the 19 20 Administrate Code, requires that every 2.1 heavy-duty trade waste hauling vehicle 22 that is owned or operated by an entity 2.3 required to be licensed or registered by the Commission and operating in New York 24 25 City, be with an equipped EPA certified

1 2007(or later) engine or utilized "Best 2 3 Available Retrofit Technology, " as defined by the New York City Department 4 5 of Environmental Protection. proposed final rules require an owner or 6 7 operator of a heavy trade waste hauling 8 vehicle that has a pre-2007 engine and 9 utilizes "best available retrofit 10 technology" as defined in section 24-163.11(b) of the Administrative Code 11 12 to obtain from the New York City 13 Department of Environmental Protection a 14 decal labeling the vehicle as compliant with Local Law 145 of 2013, and to place 15 the decal on the driver's or passenger's 16 17 door of the vehicle cab. Additionally, 18 the Commission proposes changes to the 19 penalty section of its rules, and clarifies that BIC will not issue 20 2.1 license plates to vehicles that do not 22 comply with the requirements set forth in section 24-163.11. 2.3 24 On January 27, 2020, the Commission 25 held a public hearing on the proposed

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2	rule. The Commission did not receive
3	any comments on the rule. The rule
4	change is now up for a vote as to
5	whether to adopt it. If the Commission
6	votes "yes" to adopt the rule change,
7	the final rule will be published and
8	will go into effect 30 days after
9	publication.

Step-Mar Contracting Corp 9 and 2. Salvatore Vicari d/b/a Sal 10 General Contractor. Step-Mar Contracting Corp and 11 Salvatore Vicari d/b/a Sal General 12 13 Contractor, each submitted an 14 application to renew an exemption from the licensing requirements to operate as 15 a trade waste business. 16

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The applicants were each served with a Notice of the Grounds to Recommend the Denial of their application. They were advised that the had ten business days to submit a sworn, written response to the Commission. Step-Mar Contracting Corp submitted a response on January 27, 2020, after having been granted an extension of time, and the Commission

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carefully considered the applicant's response. Salvatore Vicari did not submit a response. On February 18, 2020, we e-mailed to the Commission members the recommended denial decisions regarding the applicants at issue. There have been no material changes made to recommended denial decisions since then.

The Commission will now consider the recommended denials. For each application, the Commission members will vote as to whether or not to adopt the staff's recommendations to deny the application. A vote of "yes" is a vote to adopt the staff's recommendation. A vote of "no" is a vote not to adopt the recommendations.

The first recommendation is for

Step-Mar Contracting Corp. The staff
