PROCEEDINGS

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2 MS. PELED: Good morning, and
3 welcome to today's public hearing. The
4 time is 10:11 on Monday July 8, 2019,
5 and we are in the second floor
6 conference room of 100 Church Street.
7 My name is Leemor Peled. I am Executive
8 Agency Counsel at the New York City
9 Business Integrity Commission. Thank
10 you for attending today's hearing.

11 The Commission is conducting this
12 hearing pursuant to the requirements set
13 forth by the City Administrative
14 Procedure Act, commonly referred to as
15 "CAPA". The purpose of today's hearing
16 is to receive comments from the public on
17 the Commission's proposed amendments to
18 Title 17 of the Rules of the City of New
19 York.

20 These amendments are designed to
21 facilitate the registration of labor
22 unions and set forth requirements for
23 dissemination of workers' rights
24 information.

25 The Commission published the

2 proposed rules in the City Record on
3 June 7, 2019. We also disseminated a
4 copy of the rules via email to all New
5 York City local elected officials, the
6 managers of all 59 community boards,
7 several media organizations in the City,
8 and other interested parties. Lastly,
9 we posted the proposed rules on both the
10 Commission's and the New York City
11 Rules' websites.

12 As background for this hearing,
13 Mayor deBlasio signed into law Local Law
14 55 and 56 of 2019 on March 18, 2019.
15 The rule amendments that are the subject
16 of today's hearing are designed to
17 operationalize Local Law 55 and 56.

18 As to Local Law 55, the proposed
19 rules would facilitate the registration
20 of labor unions and labor organizations
21 and for suspending or disqualifying
22 officers of such unions or
23 organizations. Specifically, the new
24 amendments provide for application
25 requirements, general prohibitions,

1 requirements regarding the disclosure of
2 material changes to the application and
3 other pertinent information, and terms
4 and fees.

5 As to Local Law 56, these rule
6 amendments provide for requirements for
7 trade waste licensees and registrants to
8 disseminate workers' rights information
9 to employees who operate vehicles or
10 handle waste.

11 That concludes the summary of the
12 proposed rule changes at issue at this
13 hearing. You may present an oral
14 statement for the record or submit
15 written comments concerning the proposed
16 rule changes.

17 Additionally, the Commission has
18 been accepting written comments on the
19 proposed rule since the publication in
20 the City Record, and will continue to do
21 so through the close of business today.

22 The Commission will make available a
23 copy of any written comments that are
24 received in connection with today's
25 hearing on its website.

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1 Seeing as no one has requested to
