Notify BIC Online Portal

You may now use the BIC portal to report safety related events to BIC. Please visit https://nycbic.force.com/ or follow the links from our website, www.nyc.gov/bic/ to access the portal.

As a reminder, as of November 16, 2018, all BIC licensees and registrants must notify BIC of the following events within 10 business days from the day the event occurs:

- Vehicle and Traffic Summonses. You must notify BIC of all vehicle and traffic tickets issued to the company or the company's drivers while operating a vehicle on behalf of your company. You do not need to report parking tickets.
- Driver License Suspensions or Revocations. You must notify BIC if one of the company's vehicle operator's driver's license is suspended or revoked.
- Crashes. You must notify BIC if any vehicle used in the course of your business is involved in any crash, as defined by 17 RCNY § 1-01. If the company is required to file a Report of Motor Vehicle Accident (MV-104) or other forms with the New York State of DMV, you must also provide those documents to BIC.
- Determinations by Federal, State, or Local Authorities. You must notify BIC of all determinations by any federal, state, or local government agency or authority that result in (1) the suspension or revocation of a permit or license required for the operation of the company's business, (2) any injunctive relief against the company or its employees or agents, (3) a fine or penalty of more than \$1,000, or (4) the determination relates to a violation of the Vehicle and Traffic Law or any other laws relating the safe operation of a vehicle.

Failure to report these events within ten business days and/or submitting false information may subject your company to administrative penalties of up to \$10,000 per violation. *See* 17 RCNY § 1-04.
