IMPORTANT NOTICE: Workers' Rights Information MUST Be Provided to Employees Updated BIC Poster Available

To All Trade Waste Licensees and Registrants:

You are required, per Local Law 56 of 2019, to post conspicuously and provide directly to employees engaged in operating vehicles or handling waste, the following information:

- The maximum number of hours employees are permitted to work in a 24-hour period
- The minimum wage
- Any required worker safety trainings
- Information regarding what safety equipment must be provided by employers
- A description of how to contact BIC to file a complaint
- A list of additional governmental agencies that accept complaints about violations of workers' rights and their contact information, including the New York State Attorney General, the New York State Department of Labor, and the United States Department of Labor

The poster attached to this notice and posted on <u>BIC's website here</u> includes the required information and is available to use for your convenience. It will also be available in additional languages including Spanish on BIC's website in the next few weeks.

Please be advised that proof of compliance with the requirement to post such information for trade waste workers *may be requested by BIC investigators at the time of a facility visit.*

RADE WASTE WORKER RIGHTS

Per Local Law 56 of 2019, for all employees that operate vehicles and/or handle waste, BIC trade waste licensees & registrants are required to disseminate directly and to post conspicuously the following information:

MINUMUM WAGE



- You must be paid for every hour you work
 - MAY include work before and/or after your scheduled shift and time spent traveling during the workday

Minimum Wage in New York City:

- \$16.50 per hour as of January 1, 2025
- Increasing by **\$0.50 per hour** on January 1, 2026
- Beginning in 2027, the minimum wage will increase annually related to the Consumer Price Index.

HOURS



Overtime:

- Your employer must pay at least 11/2 times your regular rate of pay for hours worked over 40.
- For some drivers and helpers, the Motor Carrier Exemption to the Fair Labor Standards Act may apply. For more information see:

Maximum Number of Hours:

- NON-DRIVERS:
 - o There are no restrictions on the number of hours you are allowed to work within a 24-hour period.
- DRIVERS:
 - o After a required off-duty period of 10 or more consecutive hours, you may only drive a maximum of 11 hours during a 14-hour period after coming on duty.
 - This rule may not apply to all drivers.

WORKER SAFETY, TRAINING, & EQUIPMENT



Workers Have the Right To:

- A workplace free of known health and safety hazards
- Receive information and training about job hazards
- Personal protective equipment provided by your employer
- See any Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) citations issued to your employer
- · Request an OSHA inspection of your workplace if you believe there are unsafe or unhealthy conditions
- · File a complaint with OSHA within 30 days
