There are a number of items on our agenda today, which can be separated roughly into two categories: Rules and applications. We have three rules to consider, along with an added agenda item which I'll get to in a few minutes. We will then turn to the applications of which there are seven to consider.

At the outset, I note that all of the rules that will be considered were posted and publicly available on the BIC website beginning on June 14, 2016, and continuing through today. In addition, in accordance with applicable procedural law, copies of the rules were e-mailed to each of the Commissioners on June 13, 2016.

The first rule to consider is a proposed rule that would delegate to the Commissioner and Chair of the Business Integrity Commission the function of beginning the rulemaking process, including

amendments to the rules that the Commission just considered, we have a preliminary item related to legislation. In November of 2015, the Business Integrity Commission, along with its law enforcement partners the New York City Police Department, the Department of Investigation and the Manhattan DA's Office, concluded a two-year-long investigation into systemic fraud in the heating oil delivery industry.

Nine companies and 44 individuals were indicted for participating in a scheme to steal heating oil from customers by charging for oil that was never delivered. The scheme is called "shorting," because the defendants delivered some oil but less than what they were charging the customer for. Thus, the delivery was "short," in that it was not complete. It is estimated that the aggregate theft in the heating oil industry amounted to at least \$18 million annually, with an estimated \$4 million stolen annually from the City. The City paid at least \$117 million for fuel

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deliveries to City buildings in Fiscal Year 2014 alone.

This fraud has been going on for a very long time. There have been criminal cases brought in the past, particularly in the 1990s and early 2000s, both state and federal cases. Yet, as evidence by the indictments last November, the fraud continues.

Therefore, on the table now for the Commission's consideration is a proposal for the Commission's staff to pursue a legislative solution to this fraud, much like the legislative solution that wrenched control of the commercial garbage hauling industry from the hands of traditional organized crime. The proposal is for the staff to draft legislation and negotiate it through the proper channels with the City Council. Any final draft of legislation would then be brought before the Commission for a vote.

Each applicant was served with a Notice of Grounds to recommend the denial of its application. Each applicant was advised that it had ten business days to submit a sworn written response to the Commission. Last week, all of the Commission members were provided with the recommended denial decisions regarding these applications, as well as any responses submitted by the applicants. There have been no material changes made to any of the recommended denial decisions since then.

I will now review with the

Commission members the grounds cited for
each recommended denial. As we go through
each application, the Commission members
will vote as to whether or not to adopt the
staff's recommendation to deny the

application. A vote of "Yes" is a vote to adopt the staff's recommendation, and a vote of "No" is to not adopt the recommendation.
