RE: AMENDMENTS TO THE MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE BOARD OF  
CORRECTION OF MAY 13, 1971

We respectfully submit for your consideration the below-listed amendments to the minutes of the meeting of the Board of Correction of May 13, 1971:

1. Page 1, last paragraph, third sentence, should be amended to read, "...spoke with correction officers, the Warden, the Assistant Deputy Warden in charge of rehabilitation, and the Correction Captain in charge of rehabilitation."

2. Page 2, third paragraph, second sentence, should read, "He added that every inmate and several correction officers complained about the food."


3. Page 2, second paragraph, last sentence, should read, "Mr. Korman declared that the bulk of the Reformatory population is utilized to maintain the institution and perform menial tasks. He added that there is little time left for rehabilitation treatment."

4. Page 2, fourth paragraph, fourth sentence, should read, "Additionally, Mr. Korman stated that white prisoners were afraid to go to the gym because they felt they would be harrassed by the black prisoners."

5. Page 3, second paragraph, add, "for those serving reformatory indefinite sentences," to the end of the first sentence.

6. Page 3, fourth paragraph, last sentence, should read, "They stated that this recommendation was based on information obtained from inmates who were not working who stated that they spend the entire day watching television."
