My name is Green-Hunt, L and I am a Correction Officer at Rikers Island and I have worked in a variety of a company where the atmosphere was a little different than what I have experience here at Rikers Island. When I started in 2014 at the Department of Correction I said to myself what did I get myself into, because I saw something different than what is portrayed on the outside. I understand that both side, the inmates and the officers claim both abuses each other. What I see is there is cameras in the facilities and we have seen and heard of all the uses of force that has occurred between the Officers and the inmates.

There is a mindset in the inmates mind that once they come into the facility they believe they can say and do whatever they want without understanding that there is a process when they come in. ex. They have to be seen by the medical staff and other due process that might have to come from other department areas. Some would disrespect or threating the medical staff and officers if they are not seen right away or get their way, Some doing it intentionally for attention.

- 1. I believe that as officers we have to learn to understand and communicate with people of different cultures and backgrounds and most of all those that has mental ailment and to know the one that has a more serious mental issues verses the one that uses the system for their devices act.
