Board Chair Jennifer Jones Austin ("Chair Jones Austin") asked for a motion to approve the draft minutes of the Board's February 9, 2021 meeting. ED Egan clarified that the Board is voting on reinstating the most recent YA-ESH variance for one week. In that time, DOC will develop a plan to govern YA-ESH throughout the implementation of the proposed Restrictive Housing Rule and the end of restraint desk use by April 15, 2021.

Chair Jones Austin called for a motion to vote on the one-week variance. After Vice Chair Richards moved the item and Member Perrino seconded, the Board approved the variance, with seven votes in favor (Chair Jones Austin, Vice Chair Richards and Members Carrion, Franco, Perrino, Safyer, and Sherman) and one vote in opposition (Member Cohen).
