

There were 40 slashing/stabbing incidents in August 2022, two less than the YTD monthly average of 42.




Total Slashings and Stabbings and Average Daily Population, Sept 2020 to August 2022

From June to August 2022, GRVC had a total of 63 slashing/stabbing incidents, approximately triple the rate of the next highest facility (EMTC)


Monthly Rate (per 1,000) and Total Slashing/Stabbing Incidents - June to August 2022


There were 176 serious injury incidents in the jails in June 2022, seven higher than the YTD monthly average of 169

Class "A" UOF is the designation for UOF resulting in serious injuries. Over the first seven months of 2022, there were 247 Class "A" UOF incidents resulting in serious injury to people in custody and 18 resulting in serious injury to staff. Many Class "A" UOF injuries to people in custody are not actually the result of DOC UOF, but rather the result of a fight or an assault that DOC staff use force (typically chemical agent) to break up.




Use of Force "A" Staff and Inmate Injuries, Sept 2020 to July 2022

Use of Force "A" - Inmate Injuries

The majority of UOF do not result in serious injuries: Class "C" UOF (incidents resulting in no injury to staff members or people in custody and including the use of chemical agent spray) consistently comprise at least two-thirds of all monthly UOF, and 84% of the total in July 2022.


In July 2022, Class "A" UOF (which includes incidents that require medical treatment beyond the prescription of over-the-counter analgesics or the administration of minor first aid) represented only 6% of all UOF.



"A", "B", "C", Uses of Force, Sept 2020 to July 2022

The total number of weapons recovered in the first 7 months of 2022 was 3,774, that's 146% more than the total number of weapons recovered in 2021 during the same time period.


Monthly Total Weapon Discoveries Department-Wide September 2020 to July 2022


The total number of inmate-on-inmate of monthly fights increased 13% from 395 in January 2022 to 448 in June of 2022. There has been a 22% YTD decrease in fights from 2021 to 2022. Note: Unstaffed housing areas result in an underreporting of fights, which effects the accuracy of this data.

Following a significant increase of special searches (Tactical, ESU, Canine and Special Team) from February to May 2022, in June and July special searches decreased, while facility searches nearly doubled from 17,000 to 29,000. Despite this near doubling of facility searches, drug discoveries as a result of facility searches in June and July only increased from 47 to 55.
