By effectively detecting contraband, which currently cannot be detected in the City's jails, these scanners will provide an increased measure of safety to people working in the jails and to people in custody therein.

Slashings and stabbings remain an alarming threat in the city's jails. There were 132 slashings in the City's jails in 2017, and 19 in this year to date. These scanners would improve the Department of Correction's ability to identify and remove dangerous weapons, including knives and scalpels, which currently cannot be detected by metal detectors and are small enough to avoid detection during a pat frisk. The Department of Correction has been limited in its ability to stop the slashings, in part, because it does not have a reliable mechanism to find these weapons and remove them from circulation.

The Board recognizes that any exposure to additional ionizing radiation, even in this case when data suggests that the exposure is very low risk, should be taken seriously. Regulation and oversight by the NYC Department of Health and Mental Hygiene will create parameters for safe utilization of these scanners.

We urge you and our other state legislators to pass A6838 and allow the use of body scanners in the New York City jails. This change will have an immediate and significant impact of the reduction of violence and contraband. We write to express our support for legislation A6838 and to describe from the perspective of the New York City Board of Correction the need for the appropriate use of body scanners in the New York City jails. By effectively detecting contraband, which currently cannot be detected in the City's jails, these scanners will provide an increased measure of safety to people working in the jails and to people in custody therein.

Slashings and stabbings remain an alarming threat in the city's jails. There were 132 slashings in the City's jails in 2017, and 19 in this year to date. These scanners would improve the Department of Correction's ability to identify and remove dangerous weapons, including knives and scalpels, which currently cannot be detected by metal detectors and are small enough to avoid detection during a pat frisk. The Department of Correction has been limited in its ability to stop the slashings, in part, because it does not have a reliable mechanism to find these weapons and remove them from circulation.

The Board recognizes that any exposure to additional ionizing radiation, even in this case when data suggests that the exposure is very low risk, should be taken seriously. Regulation and oversight by the NYC Department of Health and Mental Hygiene will create parameters for safe utilization of these scanners.

We urge you and our other state legislators to pass A6838 and allow the use of body scanners in the New York City jails. This change will have an immediate and significant impact of the reduction of violence and contraband.
