- Specialized Training - For its specialized housing units (Second Chance, TRU, and Secure), DOC will be providing additional training to include the following:
 - 2-day collaborative training (DOC and H&H) – focusing on DOC programming strategy, 14-point agenda, youth development, trauma, behavior modification principles, and unit protocols
 - The 2-day training was not offered in April as staff assignments are being solidified. New dates will be scheduled to resume the training to support the YA TRU and SCH units’ transition to RNDC when staff assignments are solidified. Additionally, program refinement within ESH has been taking place over the past few months, particularly in regards to improvement of the review process and program offerings. These elements will need to be completed and incorporated into the 2-day training before it resumes.
 - 1-day overview of Dialectical Behavior Therapy and programming strategies
 - The training has been postponed and the Department is evaluating how to integrate DBT overview and programming strategies into the 2-day training.

The Department will begin providing these trainings to young adult-only ESH housing units after they have been implemented in Second Chance, TRU, and Secure.
