ii. Number of Young Adults Placed:

Second Chance Housing (SCH)

During the reporting period, ten (10) young adults were placed in SCH.

Transitional Restorative Unit (TRU)

During the reporting period, eighteen (18) young adults were placed in TRU.

Secure Unit

During the reporting period, three (3) young adults were placed in Secure Unit.

Enhanced Supervision Housing (ESH)

During the reporting period, fifteen (15) young adults were placed in ESH.

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<sup>3</sup> This young adult was 21 years old at the time of his approval for placement in ESH. He turned 22 years old prior to his transfer into ESH.

**iii. Number of Young Adults Released:**

Second Chance Housing (SCH)

During the reporting period, four (4) young adults were released from SCH.

Transitional Restorative Unit (TRU)

During the reporting period, twelve (12) young adults were released from TRU.

Secure Unit

During the reporting period, three (3) young adults were released from Secure Unit.

Enhanced Supervision Housing (ESH)

During the reporting period, three (3) young adults were released from ESH.

**iv. The number of young adults who had a previous placement(s) in ESH, TRU, Second Chance, or the Secure Unit, other than a step-down from TRU or Secure Unit during their current incarceration:**

During this reporting period, there were ten (10) young adults who met this criteria:

- Two (2) young adults had a previous placement in TRU, placed in General Population, and were placed in Second Chance
- One (1) young adult had a previous placement in Second Chance, placed in General Population, and was placed back in Second Chance
- One (1) young adult was previously placed in TRU, placed in APU, placed in General Population, and was placed back in TRU
- One (1) young adult was previously placed in Second Chance, placed in General Population, and was placed in ESH
- Two (2) young adults were previously placed in TRU, placed in General Population, and was placed back in TRU
- One (1) young adult was previously placed in TRU, placed in General Population, placed in APU, and was placed in Secure Unit
- One (1) young adult was previously placed in Second Chance, placed in General Population, placed in Administrative Segregation, and was placed in ESH
- One (1) young adult was previously placed in Second Chance, placed in TRU, placed in General Population, placed in APU, placed back in General Population, and was placed back in TRU

**v. The number of young adults who met the criteria for a timely case review;**

All young adults placed in Second Chance and TRU receive their first Support Team review after being in the unit for two weeks. From that point forward, the young adults receive weekly Support Team reviews. All young adults placed in the Secure Unit receive weekly Support Team reviews.

During the reporting period, thirty-six (36) young adults met the criteria for case reviews:

- Second Chance: Six (6) young adults met the criteria for case reviews.
- TRU: Nineteen (19) young adults met the criteria for case reviews.
- Secure Unit: Eight (8) young adults met the criteria for case reviews.
- ESH: Three (3) young adults met the criteria for case reviews.

**vi. The number of young adults who received such review;**

During the reporting period, thirty-six (36) young adults received case reviews:

- Second Chance: Six (6) young adults received their case reviews.
- TRU: Nineteen (19) young adults received their case reviews.
- Secure Unit: Eight (8) young adults received their case reviews.
- ESH: Three (3) young adults received case reviews.

**vii. The number of reviews that resulted in placement in an alternative housing area:**

During the reporting period, seventeen (17) young adults received case reviews that resulted in their placement in an alternative housing area:

- Second Chance: Four (4) young adults were placed in an alternative housing area as a result of their case review.
- TRU: Twelve (12) young adults were placed in an alternative housing area as a result of their case review.
- Secure Unit: One (1) young adult was placed in an alternative housing area as a result of their case review.
