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c. *Overview of commingled programming:*

- I. **Internal:** DOC-led programming. As a result of COVID-19, the Department revised programming services to include the provision of self-guided packages that has content such as activity packets, interactional journaling, and evidenced-based curriculum worksheets. Program Counselors conduct follow-up sessions to respond to questions and ensure the completion of the self-guided packets. Social service slips are made available as an additional service offered.

- II. **External:** DOC partners with seven nonprofit organizations to support incarcerated individuals pre and post release. As a result of COVID-19, the Department worked with providers to implement social distancing programming and have collaborated to development and distribute curriculum and activity packages, ensure that individuals are offered assistance with discharge planning, and provide post-release support to individuals. The distribution of external self-guided materials was modified to be afforded to individuals upon request rather than a general distribution. The Department coordinated with partners to arrange discharge planning hotlines that allow persons in custody to connect to essential services.
