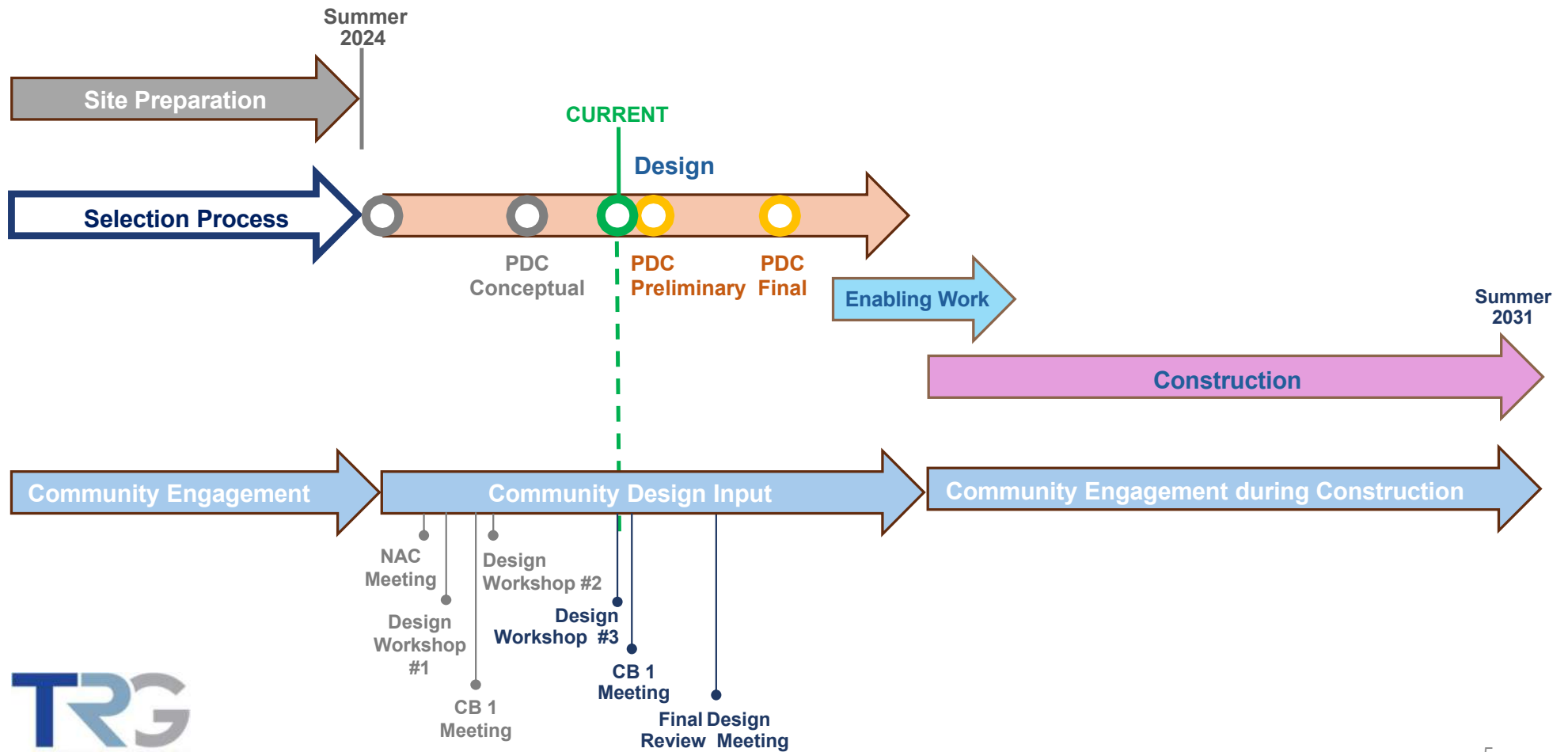

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# Project Goals and Guiding Principles

## PROJECT GOALS AND GUIDING PRINCIPLES

**Our Purpose: To design and build safe and humane facilities that support NYC's commitment to justice reform.**

Program Goals:

- Facility grounded in **dignity and respect**
- **Safe, humane, secure**, and efficient environment
- **Exemplary public architecture**
- Relate to the City it is in and **create a sense of place**
- **Thoughtful engagement** with city agencies and community partners
- **Minimize impacts** to neighboring properties/community
- Provide for **site safety**
- Optimize overall operations and maintenance efficiency
- Complete within budget and on schedule
- Robust **minority and women-owned** business enterprise participation
- Exemplify DDC's **principles of excellence** in design, construction, and project delivery

# PROJECT GOALS AND GUIDING PRINCIPLES

## KEY ELEMENTS

- **1,040 beds for men**
  - Maximizes flexibility of movement between housing areas for populations that cannot mix
  - Balanced therapeutic capacity
  - Retains programmatic elements, including the gymnasium, multi-purpose rooms, and educational and workforce development spaces
- **120 accessory parking spaces below grade**
  - Parking for authorized City vehicles only
- **40,000 SF of community/retail space**
  - Will operate separately from the jail facility

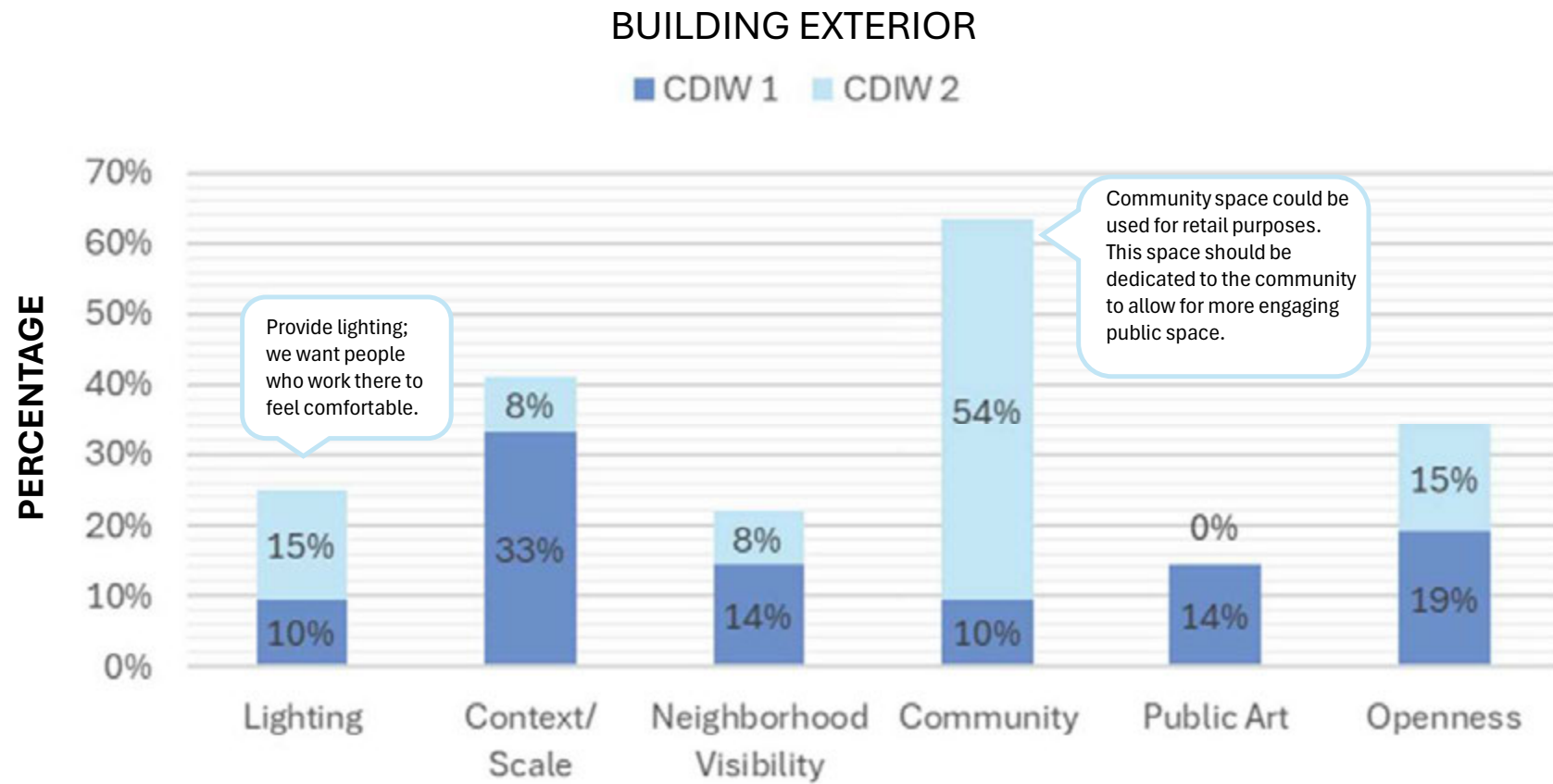

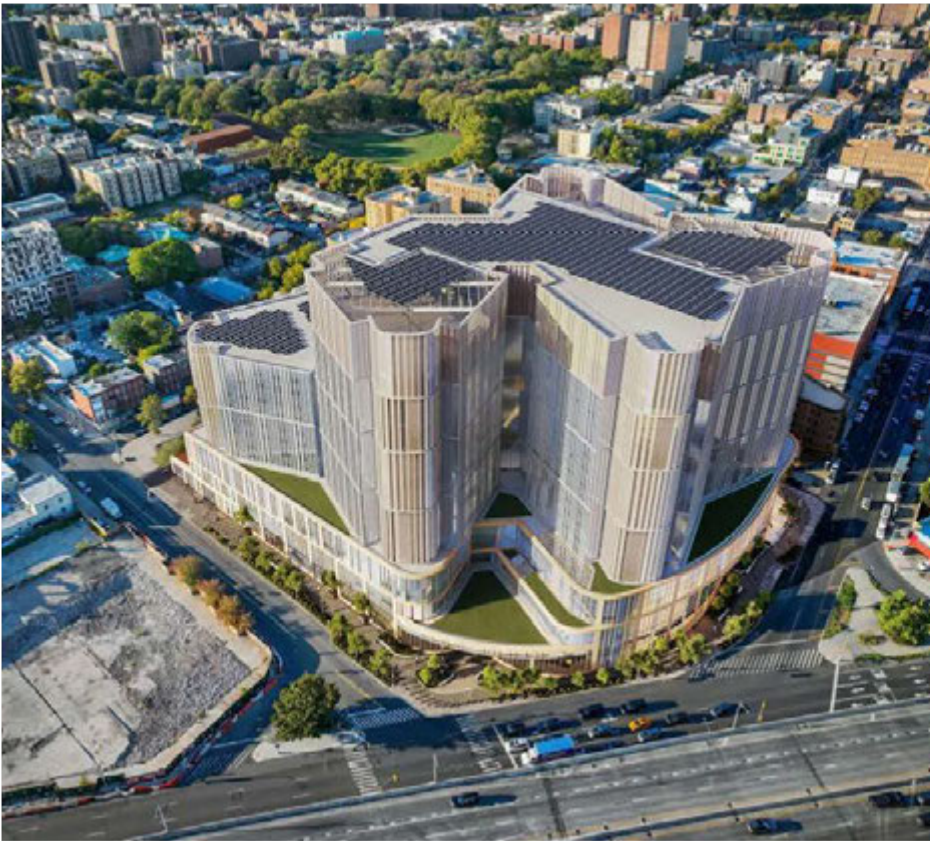

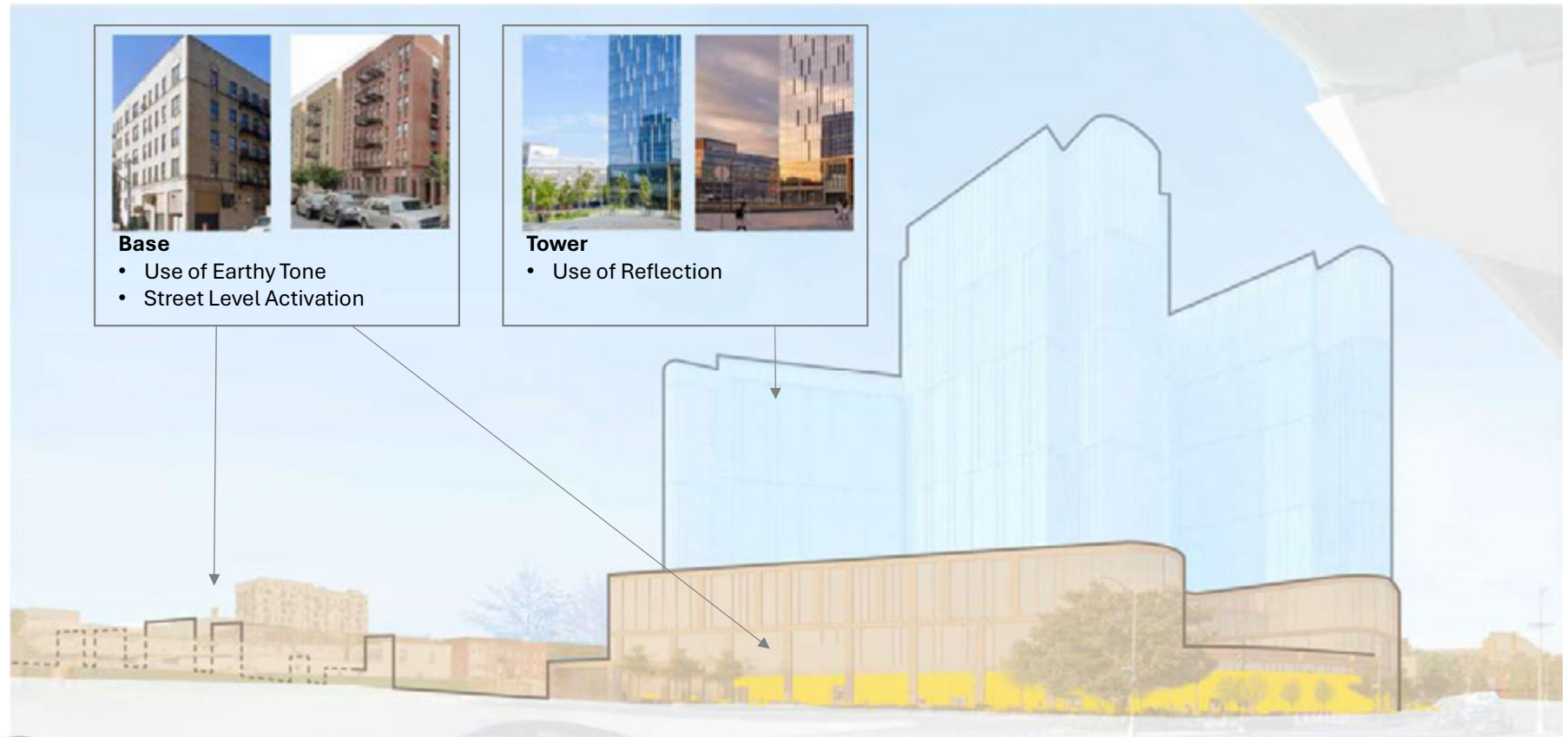

### Design Features:

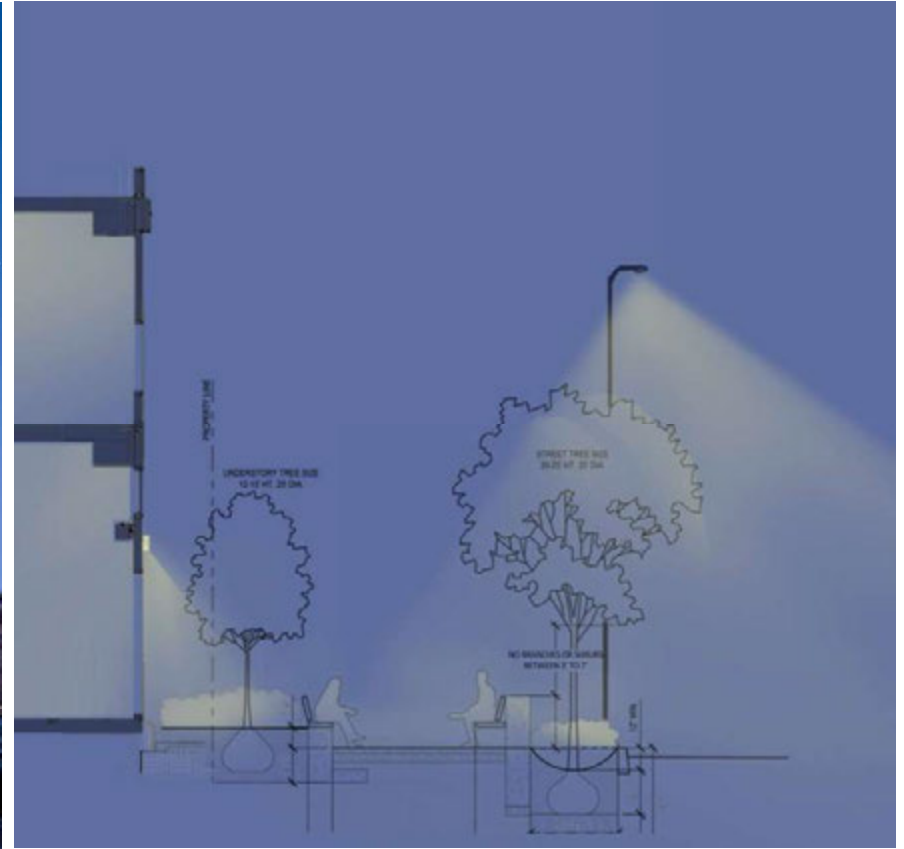
1. Bird-friendly **glazing** design.

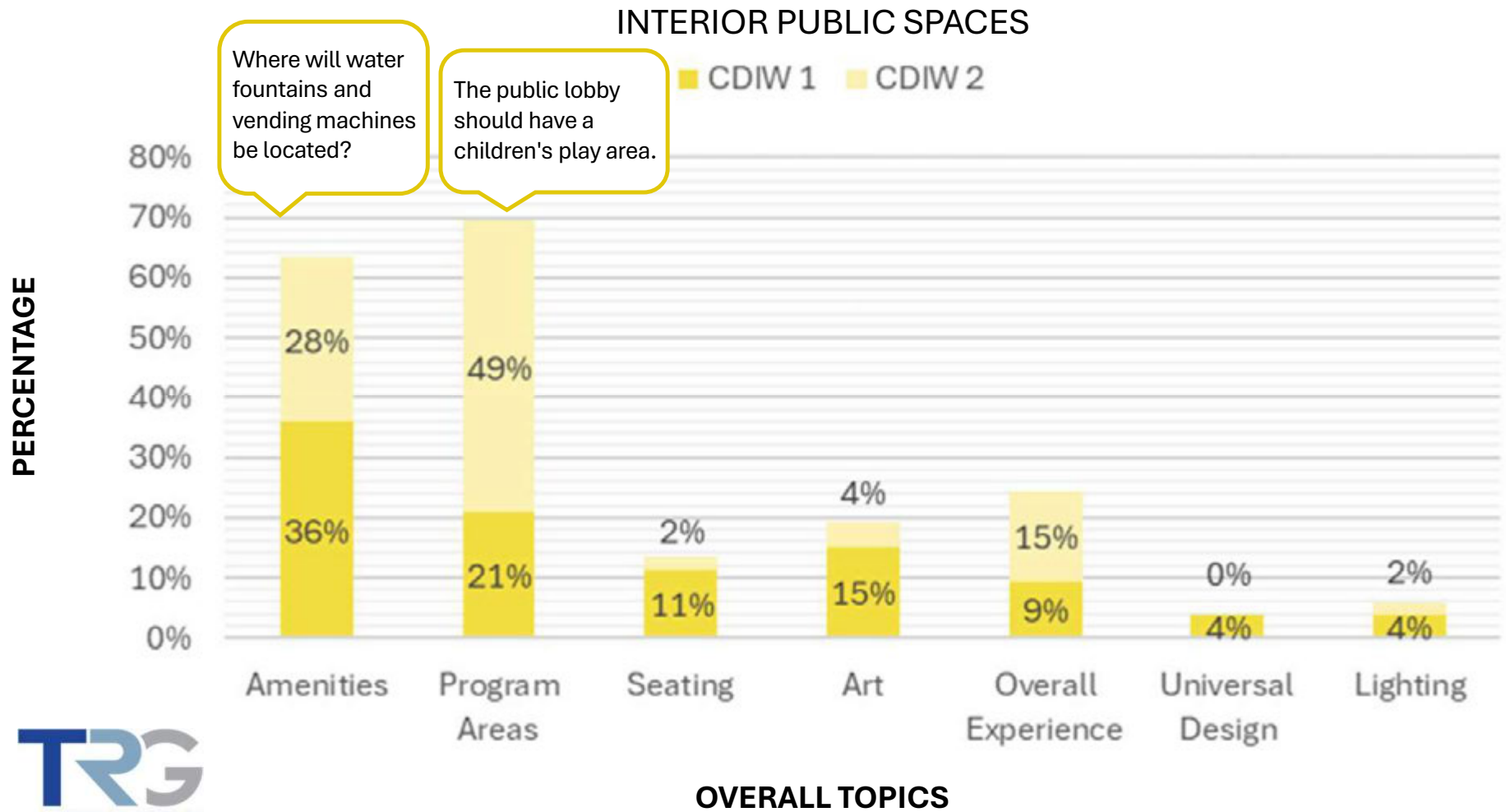

- Create an engaging and fun children's area
- Provide vending machines and water fountains throughout easily accessible areas

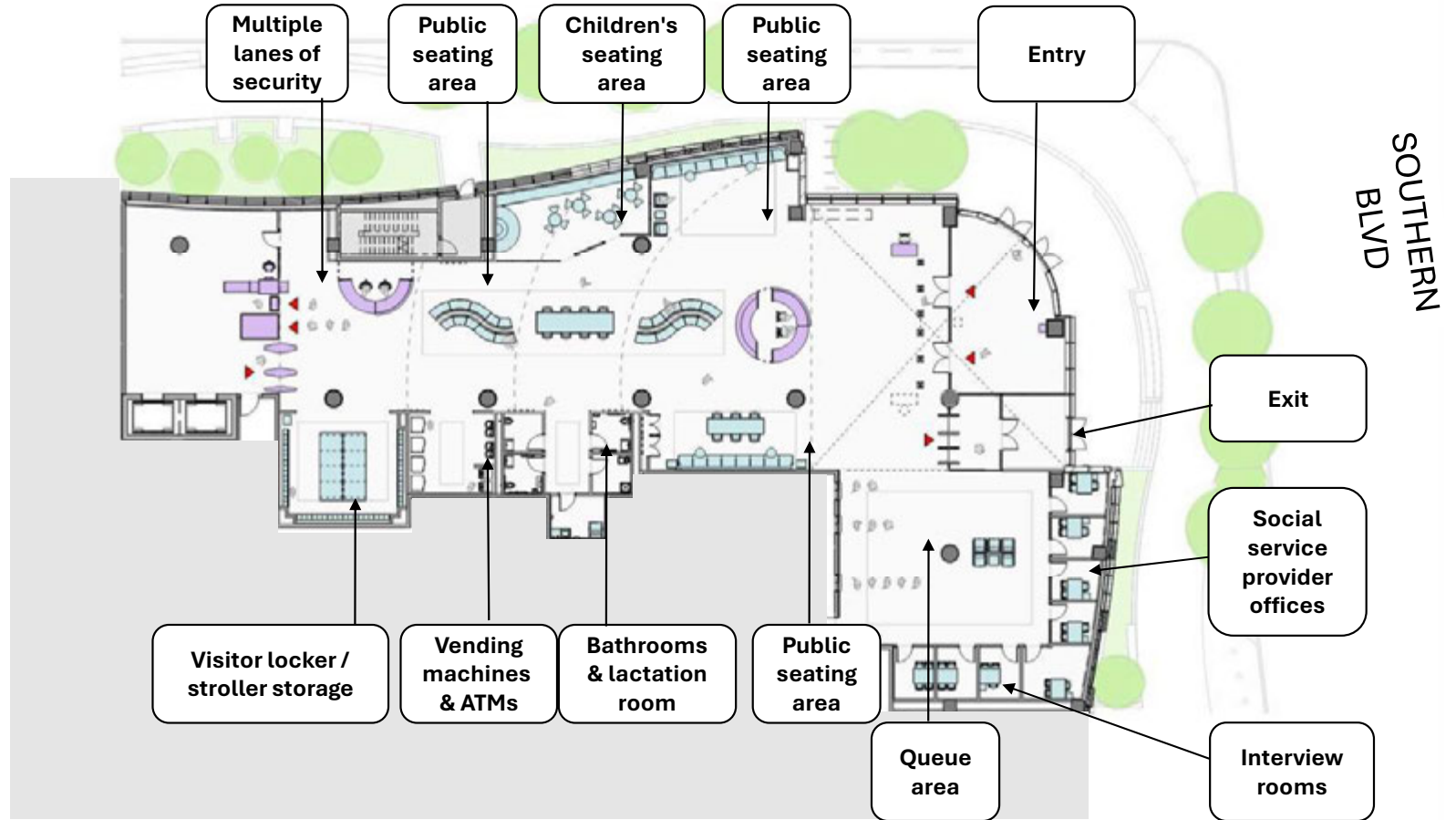
### DESIGN CONSIDERATIONS

- Create spaces that are comfortable and humane through exploration of lighting, materials, colors, finish materials, and furniture

## RENDERING – PUBLIC LOBBY

### What was said:

- How can the space be used by the public?

### Design Features:

- Designed a **welcoming lobby** with reception desk centered upon entry to navigate public visitors to different programs within the space.
- **Children's play area, vending machines and drinking fountains** are available for public use.

## RENDERING – PUBLIC LOBBY

### Design Features:

- Integrated **natural light** throughout the space, complemented by warm, inviting finish materials to enhance overall experience.
- Developed **seating options** tailored to both individual and group needs.

## RENDERING – PUBLIC LOBBY

### What was said:

- The public lobby should have a space for kids with natural light and comfortable furniture.

### Design Features:

- Created a children's area within the public lobby space that incorporates **natural light** and **comfortable furniture** options.

# INTERIOR PUBLIC SPACE

## RENDERING – PUBLIC LOBBY

### What was said:

- Where are water fountains and vending machines located?
- What features can we expect to see within the public lobby?

### Design Features:

- **Water fountains** and **vending machines** are located throughout the spaces in easily accessible areas.
- **Locker Areas** are provided for visitor storage.
- Designed **seating solutions** for both individual and group settings, featuring **warm materials** and a **welcoming color palette** to promote comfort and engagement.



# INTERIOR PUBLIC SPACE

## RENDERING – VISITORS WAITING AREA

### Design Features:

- **Natural light** is incorporated throughout the space.
- Designed **seating** using inviting materials and a thoughtful color palette to enhance **comfort and visual appeal**.

- Developed private **non-contact booths** for visits with friends, family and lawyers.

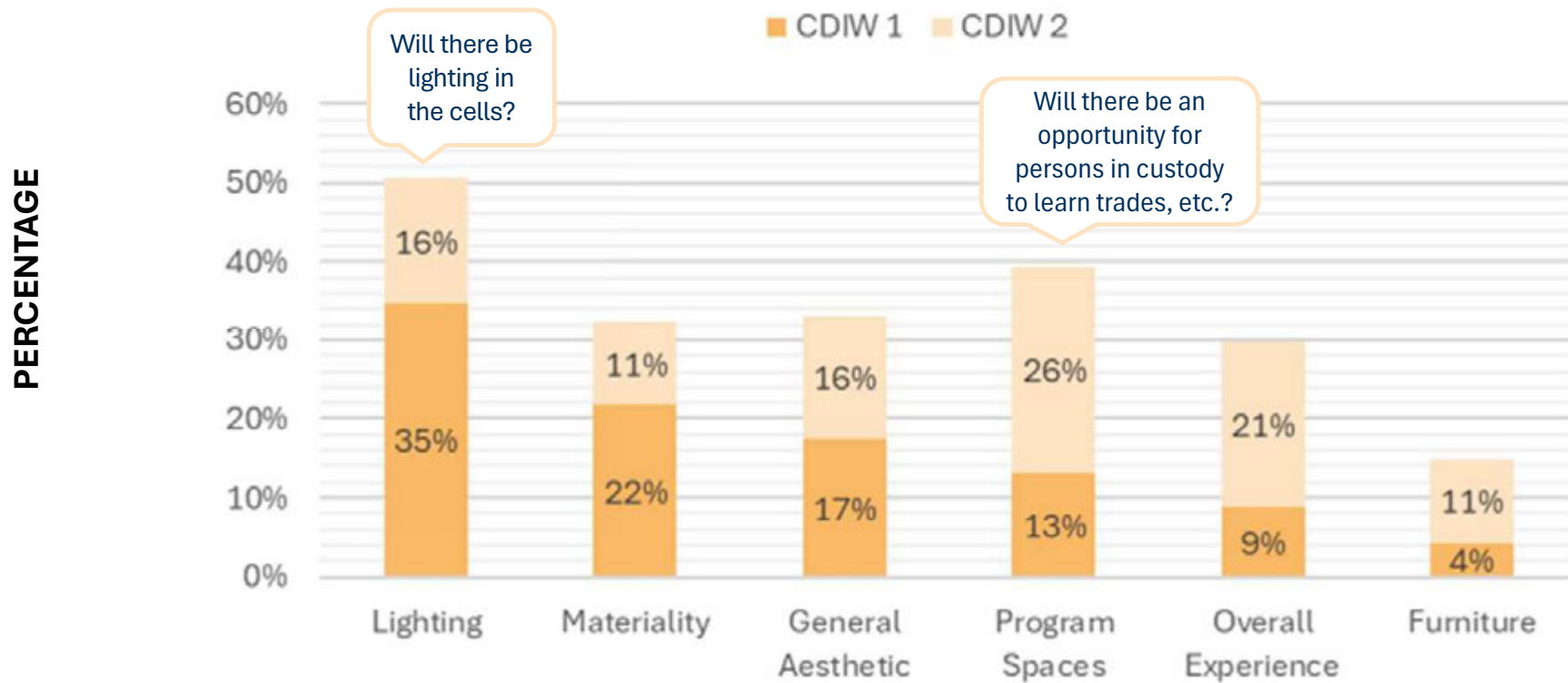

### DESIGN ACTION ITEMS

- Explore opportunities of natural light in secure spaces
- Develop new renderings to show secure spaces to the community
- Ensure the secure spaces provided meet accessibility requirements

### DESIGN CONSIDERATIONS

- Consider incorporating art within interior secure spaces

# INTERIOR SECURE SPACE

## RENDERING – CELL DESIGN

### What was said:

- Is there storage in the cells?
- Will sinks and toilets be in all cells?
- Will there be lighting in the cells?

### Design Features:

- **Storage** is embedded within the furniture.
- **Plumbing fixtures** are provided in the cell.
- Overhead and task lighting are strategically integrated in each cell to provide balanced and functional **interior lighting**.

# INTERIOR SECURE SPACE

## RENDERING – GENERAL POPULATION DAY ROOM

### What was said:

- Add spaces for games/ programs in secure spaces.

### Design Features:

- Each housing unit has a **multi-purpose room** available for group activities including games.
- The dayroom has incorporated **lighting fixtures** and **ceiling design** to improve the feel of the space.

# INTERIOR SECURE SPACE

## RENDERING – OUTDOOR RECREATION ACCESSIBILITY FROM DAY ROOM

### Design Feature:

- Every housing unit has an attached **outdoor recreation area** that can be accessed through the day rooms.



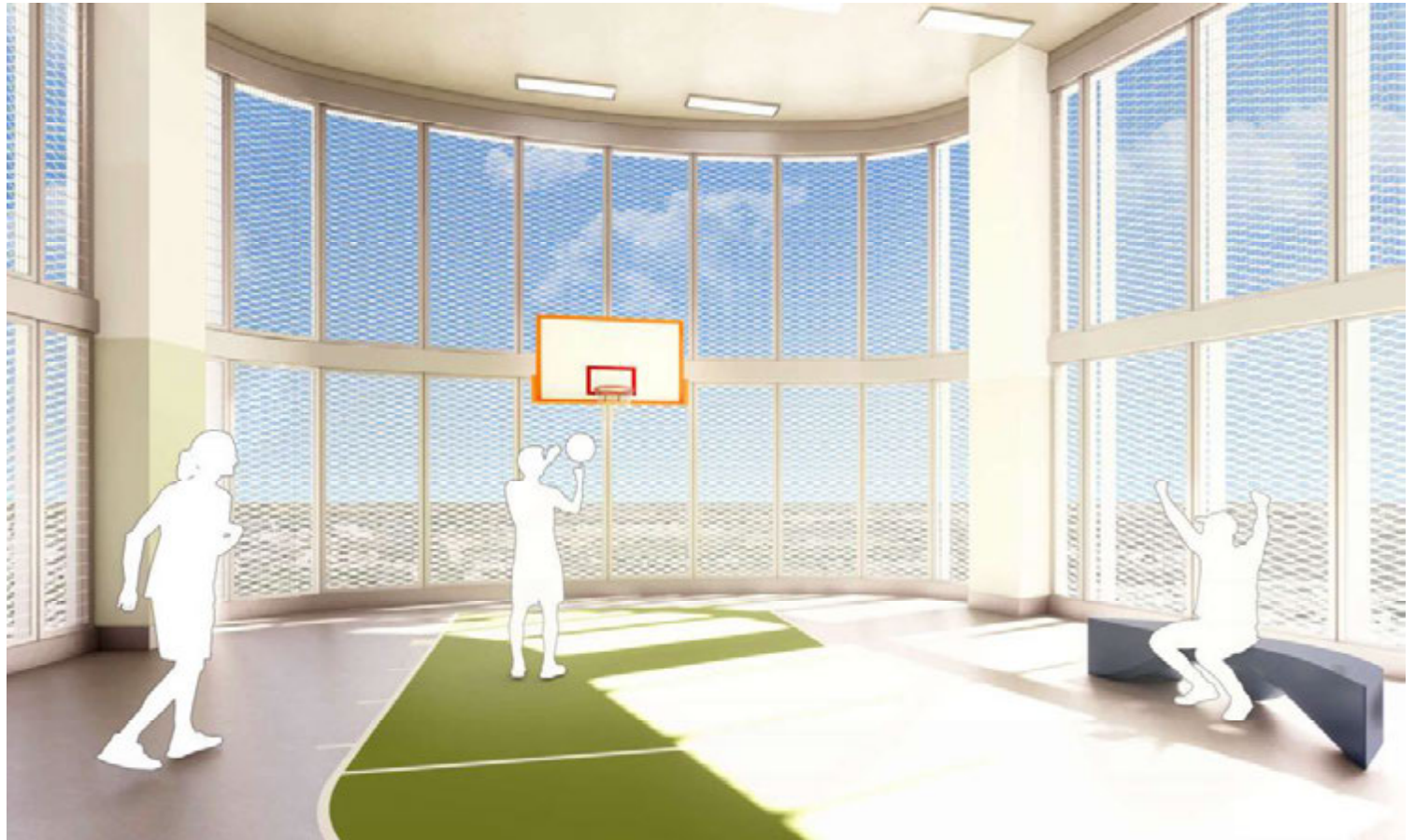

# INTERIOR SECURE SPACE

## RENDERING – OUTDOOR RECREATION

### Design Feature:

- Three sides of the outdoor recreation area are open to the elements, creating an open-air experience that allows for **natural light** and a **strong connection to the outdoors**.

## RENDERING – OUTDOOR RECREATION

### Design Feature:

- Each **outdoor recreation** space will have stationary exercise equipment available for use.

# INTERIOR SECURE SPACE

## RENDERING – INDOOR RECREATION

### What was said:

- Is there an indoor recreation space as an alternative to the outdoor recreation space for bad weather days?

### Design Features:

- The facility has an **indoor gymnasium** that includes a basketball court and an activities room with stationary exercise equipment.
- Enlarged windows to **maximize daylight** in the space.

# INTERIOR SECURE SPACE

## RENDERING – OUTDOOR HORTICULTURE

### Design Features:

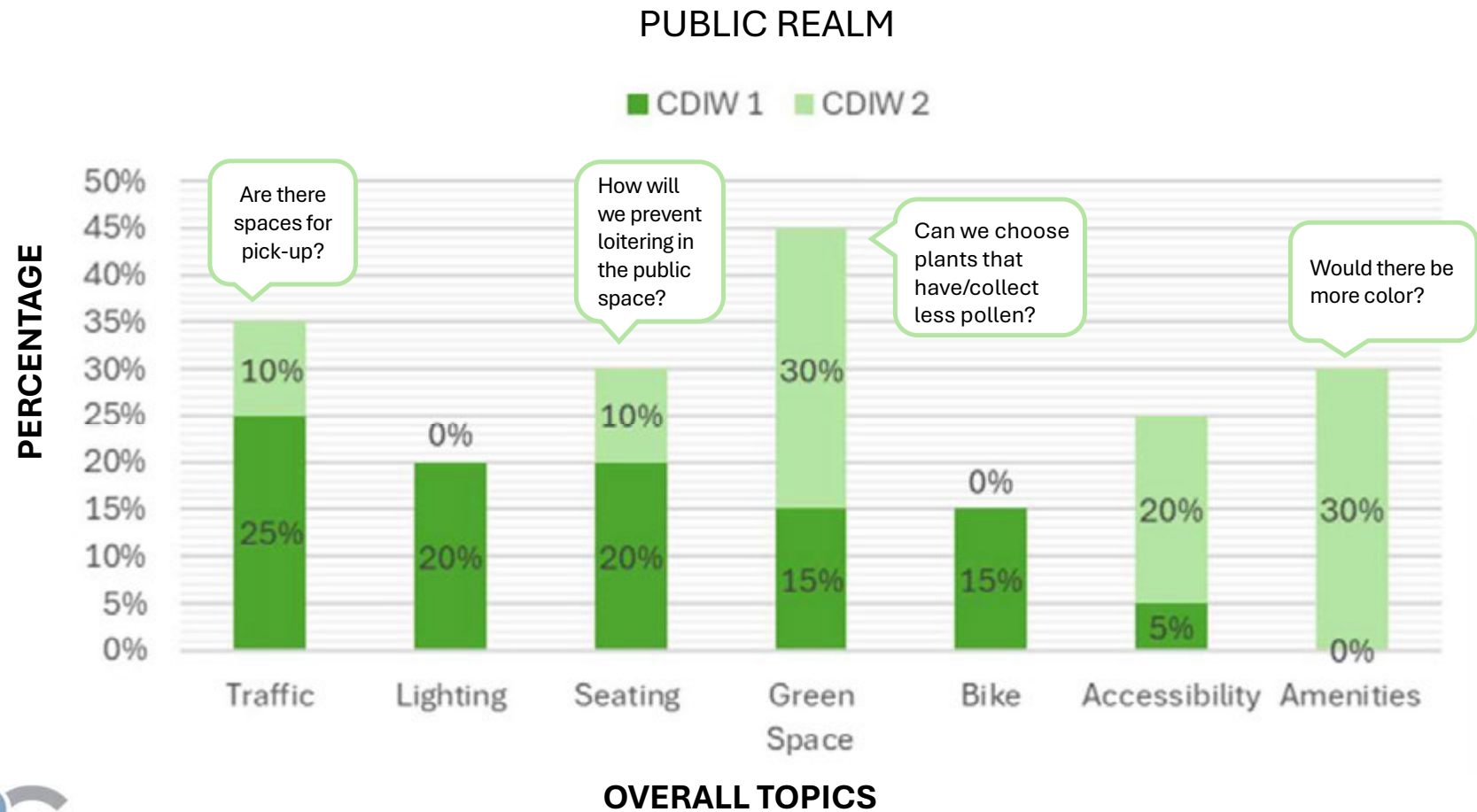
- Furniture and plantings have been laid out maximize **southern exposure**.
- Outdoor horticulture space has **fully accessible** planters.

# SUMMARY OF WHAT WE HEARD

## DESIGN ACTION ITEMS

- Add color to the streetscape
- Site features should discourage loitering
- Include low pollen producing plants

## DESIGN CONSIDERATIONS

- Investigate building lighting to add to the streetscape lighting plan
- Consider art in the landscape to give the site a sense of place
- Consider a land acknowledgement as part of the streetscape

# PUBLIC REALM – SITE PLAN

## What was said:

- The streetscape should be easily accessible for the families and staff.
- Are there spaces for pick-up?
- Would there be more color?

## Design Features:

- Added **formal planting** and increased **seating**.
- **Pick-up spaces** are provided on Southern Blvd.
- **Color of streetscape** materials is updated to match building façade.

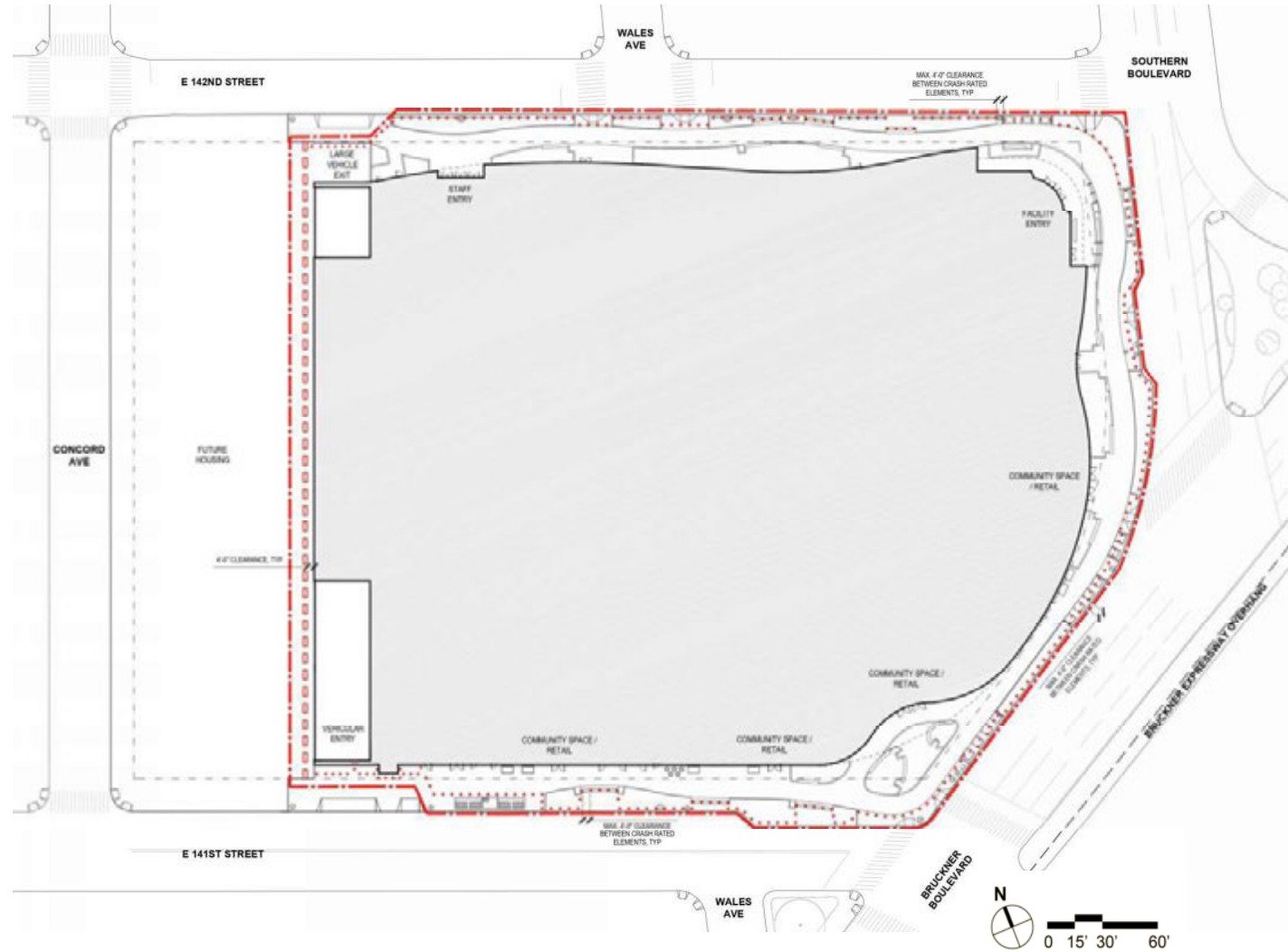


# PUBLIC REALM – SITE SECURITY

## Design Features:

Perimeter barriers that protect pedestrians and building occupants from vehicular threats include:

- Bollards
- Planters
- Seat walls
- Structural walls



# PUBLIC REALM – SITE SECURITY PALETTE

## Design Features:

- Perimeter barriers protect pedestrians and building occupants from vehicular threats.

# PUBLIC REALM – GREEN ROOF PLAN

## What was said:

- We don't need more green spaces surrounded by fencing. If the space isn't usable, create pollinator gardens.

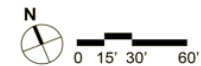
## Design Features:

### Level 2

- Trees and shrubs provide habitat, **pollinator species** and screening vents on the west side of the building.

### Level 2-4

- Sedum green roofs with drifts of white flowering plants provide **pollinator species**.



# PUBLIC REALM – PLANTING SELECTION

## What was said:

- Can we choose plants that have/collect less pollen?
- Would there be more color?

## Design Features:

- **Low pollen selections**
- **Colorful** from spring through fall
- Deciduous and evergreen
- Hardy
- **Pollinator-friendly**
- Low maintenance
