February 3rd, 2025

Opening Remarks and Quote Sharing

- Chairperson Clarisa Alayeto opens the meeting, reminding everyone about Black History Month and shares a quote by Martin Luther King Jr. about the moral universe bending towards justice.
- Clarisa invites others to share their thoughts on the quote and take a moment to reflect.
- Chairperso Clarisa Alayeto gives 1st Vice Chair Freddy Perez Jr. and 2nd Vice Chair Ngande Ambroise an opportunity to share updates or information.

DMS Updates and Office Space Status

- District Manager Anthony Jordan provides updates on the office space, mentioning a flood that affected the entire property and the city's mandate for a 90-day remediation period.
- District Manager Anthony Jordan discusses the temporary hosting arrangement at the Bronx Business Center and the limitations of this setup.
- He mentions that all committee and other meetings will continue at Lincoln Hospital until further notice.
- District Manager Anthony Jordan updates on the pantry arrangements, finalizing an arrangement with a local mosque despite liability issues.
- Chairperson Clarisa Alayeto suggests purchasing folding tables for the pantry.

Community Associate Position and Youth and Education Update

- District Manager Anthony Jordan announces the final stages of hiring a community associate to help with outreach initiatives.
- He emphasizes the importance of this role in supporting Community Coordinator Steven and Chairperson Clarisa Alayeto in their work.
- Committee Chair Daniel Barber shares updates on the youth and education committee, mentioning a recent town hall meeting and the opposition to a 22-bed facility.
- Committee Chair Daniel Barber expresses frustration with the lack of support from co-chairs and stresses the importance of unity in their fight.

Discussion on Shelter and Migrant Issues

- Committee Chair Evelyn Alvarez and others discuss the challenges of addressing migrant and shelter issues, emphasizing the need for clear communication and avoiding anti-migrant sentiments.

- The group agrees on the importance of meeting with politicians in a private setting to have more productive conversations.
- Clarisa suggests setting up another meeting with the executive team to discuss merging committees and improving attendance.
- The meeting concludes with a reminder to share any additional resources or information in the WhatsApp group and to continue supporting the community.

Action Items

Obtain the number of clinics/service providers in the community board district from Anthony Jordan.

Reach out to Mayor Adams Administration to invite her to a meeting to discuss immigration-related resources and support.

Develop a template for the 40th Precinct to provide specific data and statistics at community board meetings.

Schedule a meeting with the 40th Precinct command officer to discuss expectations for data and statistics presentation at community board meetings.
