General Board Meeting Minutes January 30th, 2025

Meeting Commencement and Roll Call

- 1st Vice Chair Freddy Perez assumes the role of acting chair in the absence of the regular chair.
- Roll call is conducted, listing all present board members and their names.
- Motion to approve the agenda with modifications is made by Member Dalourny Nemorin and seconded by Member Patricia Simpson.
- Motion to approve the full board minutes is made by Member Josephine Fernandez-Byrne and seconded by Member Mohammed Sheikh

Public Session: Carmen Santiago's Address

- Carmen Santiago, a resident of Mount Haven, addresses the board, expressing gratitude to NYPD and urging young people to run for office.
- Santiago raises concerns about the drug needle distribution program and the need for inpatient care for those struggling with addiction.
- District Manager Anthony Jordan, a sergeant, responds to Santiago's questions, explaining the board's structure and the importance of committee meetings.
- Jordan emphasizes the board's ongoing efforts to address open drug use and sanitation issues, mentioning regular meetings with city agency leaders.

Financial Education Workshop Proposal

- Lillian Salas Wilkin from Primary Care Financial Services proposes financial education workshops for the community.
- Wilkin highlights the importance of financial literacy and the underserved nature of the community.
- Contact information for Wilkin and her colleague, Cheryl Ru, is provided for further inquiries.

40th Precinct Report

- Georgia Bucha, the neighborhood coordination sergeant, explains the precinct's structure and responsibilities.
- Bucha mentions the precinct's community board meeting held every first Wednesday of the month.
- Shay McClellan, a reporter, asks about the presence of mobile field forces at hospitals, to which Bucha responds affirmatively.
- Member Ngande Ambroise raises concerns about abandoned cars in the neighborhood, and Bucha promises to address the issue.

Community Concerns and NYPD's Response

- Member Ngande Ambroise, questions the NYPD's handling of abandoned cars and the need for better communication of operation plans.
- Anthony Jordan explains the process and the importance of community involvement in reporting issues.
- A resident, Lillian, expresses concerns about the safety of her neighborhood due to a new migrant shelter and asks about training to handle guns.
- District Manager Jordan clarifies the process for obtaining a gun license and emphasizes the importance of professional handling of such matters.

Discussion on Bylaws and Policy Letter

- Member Dalourny Nemorin moves to amend the agenda to discuss the bylaws and a policy letter.
- The board discusses the need for more time to review the bylaws and the importance of addressing the policy letter promptly.
- The policy letter, addressing the new immigration law, is read and discussed, with concerns raised about the potential impact on the community.
- The board votes on the policy letter, with some members expressing the need for more time to review and discuss the implications.

Elected Officials Reports

- Leonardo Coello from the Mayor's Office discusses the city's efforts to address homelessness and the new "City of Yes for Families" initiative.
- Leonardo Coello highlights the importance of community input on the initiative and mentions upcoming legislative efforts, including the "Ask the Tax" legislation.

- Nipa from Congresswoman Alexandria Ocasio Cortez's office provides updates on immigration concerns and upcoming legislative priorities.
- Representatives from Senator Serrano's and Assembly Member Jackson's offices address
 community concerns about the migrant shelter and provide information on available
 resources and upcoming constituent services.

Final Remarks and Closing

- Whitney Brimat, Chief of Staff for Assembly Member Septimo, announces a summit to address drug use issues in the Hub and the availability of free legal advice in the office.
- Nico from Juventud Unida por la Independencia raises concerns about legal support for tenants displaced after a fire, and Williams provides contact information for relevant organizations.
- The meeting concludes with a reminder of the importance of community involvement and the availability of resources and support from elected officials and community boards.

Community Services and Resources

- Gloria Cruz from the city council district eight announced the submission dates for expense applications and non-capital deadlines, which are March 20.
- Free tax prep services are available every Monday and Tuesday at their office, with appointments made via a QR code or by calling the office.
- Free immigration services are offered at St. Jerome's hands, and free legal services are available on February 21 for veterans and their families.
- Gloria Cruz distributed "Know Your Rights" cards in four languages, advising people on how to respond if ICE comes to their door.

Traffic Control and Data-Driven City

- Gloria Cruz addressed concerns about traffic control and the lengthy process involved in getting traffic surveys and stop signs approved.
- Emphasized the importance of calling 311 to collect data and bring awareness to traffic issues.
- Mentioned a 10-year process to get a four-way stop sign in Cyprus, highlighting the datadriven approach of the city.
- Encouraged the community to call 311 or contact her office for assistance with trafficrelated issues.

Re-Entry Employment Resource Fair

• Jeffrey Pena, a community engagement coordinator, reported on the success of the reentry employment resource fair held on Tuesday.

- Over 130 people attended, including those impacted by justice, with services like free haircuts, hygiene kits, and mock interviews.
- The Department of Motor Vehicles issued pre-identification cards, and actual employers were on-site for interviews.
- Plans for a future fair focused on women impacted by justice were discussed, with a flyer to be sent out early next month.

Committee Report: Melrose Commons Project

- Paola Martinez, Committee Chair of Economic Development, Land Use, Housing & Zoning, discussed the Melrose Commons project, a 214-unit affordable housing project with 100% affordable housing.
- The project includes 214 units ranging from studios to three-bedroom apartments, with 40% being two or three-bedroom units.
- The building features ground floor retail, three elevators, a community room, and a rooftop terrace with a production farm.
- The community had questions about transportation, trash collection, and security, with a follow-up presentation and vote planned for the next committee meeting.

Public and Transitional Housing Concerns

- Anthony Jordan, District Manager, discussed the city's plan to open a 2200-bed single male migrant facility in the South Bronx.
- The community was not informed about the facility until a committee hearing, leading to concerns about its impact on schools and families.
- Elected officials and community members expressed their concerns during the hearing, emphasizing the need for quality of life standards and resources for the facility's residents.
- The community board will continue to work with the administration and elected officials to ensure the facility meets community standards.

Environmental Justice and Sanitation Issues

- The Environmental Justice and Sanitation Committee addressed trash and waste issues, with plans for an Earth Day cleanup.
- Concerns about dog poop in the district were highlighted, with a call for stricter enforcement of leash laws.
- Grant proposals for community cleanups and tree pits were discussed, along with congestion pricing and an elected candidate forum.

• The committee emphasized the need for advocacy and enforcement to address environmental issues in the district.

Health and Human Services Overview

- Marilyn Pena, Chairperson for the Health and Human Services Committee, provided an overview of the Samaritan Daytop Village.
- The facility offers services for substance use, mental health, and medication-assisted treatment, with a central admissions process for assessments.
- Action items included collaborating with the 40th precinct and other community stakeholders to address safety concerns.
- Emphasized the importance of community involvement and participation in committee meetings to stay informed and address local issues.

Legislation and Voter Registration

- Committee Chair of Policy & Legislation Dalourny Nemorin discussed the challenges faced by the Board of Elections, including limited language support and outdated turnout numbers.
- Encouraged community members to register to vote and ensure their party affiliation is correct before the February 14 deadline.
- Proposed informational sessions on topics like bail, discovery, and ranked-choice voting to help the community understand the legal system.
- Emphasized the importance of attending committee meetings to stay informed and engaged in local issues.

Immigration Committee and Community Support

- The Immigration Committee discussed the anxiety and fear among immigrants in the district, emphasizing the need for a 24/7 help center.
- Encouraged community members to attend committee meetings to address immigrationrelated issues and provide support.
- Mentioned the availability of "Know Your Rights" cards and the importance of staying informed and united against city decisions that impact the community.
- Emphasized the role of the community board in supporting immigrants and advocating for their rights and needs.

Old Business and Meeting Adjournment

• Member Dalourny Nemorin made a motion to adjourn the meeting, with no further discussion or motions from the attendees.

- Emphasized the importance of community involvement and participation in committee meetings to address local issues and stay informed.
- Encouraged community members to reach out to the community board and elected officials for support and assistance.

Action Items

- Email the revised bylaws to all board members for review before the next meeting.
- Coordinate a virtual "Know Your Rights" training session on immigration in collaboration with congressional representatives.
- Follow up with the 40th precinct on the specific location and timing of the reported drug activity and noise issues in the hub area.
- Reach out to the office of Assembly Member Septimo to inquire about the legal advisory services they provide.
- Submit feedback on budget priorities and ideas for beautifying Railroad Park to Assembly Member Jackson's office by February 10.
