#### **Opening Remarks and Introductions**

- Committee Chair Mohammed Sheikh opens the meeting, welcoming everyone and emphasizing the importance of collaboration and community input.
- Marilyn Pena introduces herself as the chairperson of health and human services.
- Argelia Ortiz introduces herself as the secretary of the immigration committee.
- District Manager Anthony Jordan expresses concern about misinformation surrounding immigration and the need for accurate information to prevent panic and fear.

- Plans for future virtual informational workshops are discussed to address the anxiety caused by federal executive orders.

- Speaker 1 mentions the challenges faced due to the renovation of the community board office, which limits in-person meetings.
- Anthony Jordan shares his experience with the challenges immigrants face and the importance of providing accurate information.
- The committee discusses the need for credible organizations and professionals to conduct workshops and provide legal assistance.

- The importance of directing people to elected officials and legal aid offices for immediate assistance is emphasized.
- Rosemary shares her experience with Know Your Rights workshops and the need for resources like cards with information in multiple languages.
- The committee discusses the challenges of mixed-status families and the importance of addressing different scenarios during workshops.
