**Roll Call and Public Session**

- 1<sup>st</sup> Vice Chair Josephine Fernandez-Byrne calls the General Board meeting to order at 6:17 PM and asks for roll call.
- Anthony Jordan lists the attendees, noting the absence of a quorum.
- Michael Steedly from Jobs Plus in the South Bronx is invited to speak.
- Michael Steedly explains the services provided by Jobs Plus, including resume building, vocational training, and mental health services.

**Jobs Plus Services and Community Events**

- Michael Steedly details the upcoming turkey and produce giveaways organized by Jobs Plus.
- Member Cesar Yoc inquires about the GED program, and Michael Steedly confirms its continuation with various classes.
- Michael Steedly offers to provide flyers for community events but did not bring them to the meeting.
- Member Edwin Diaz asks about the business hours and age requirements for Jobs Plus, and Michael provides the details.

**Cultural Traditions and Homeless Shelters**

- Member Argelia Ortiz announces a cultural event involving music, dancing, and a parade to La Casita.

- Herman Francis discusses the issue of homeless shelters in the district and the financial burden on the city.
- Herman highlights the low per capita income in the district and the impact of low voter turnout.
- Herman mentions the crisis in affordable housing and the profit made by private developers.

- Maritza Wiggins from Councilmember Rafael Salamanca's office announces the annual holiday lights event at the Bronx Zoo.

### **Community Engagement and Safety Initiatives**

- Jumanah Escalera from the Bronx District Attorney's office discusses the gun buyback program and upcoming events.
- The gun buyback program offers gift cards and electronics in exchange for firearms.
- Additional events include a beyond the block event focused on providing resources for youth.
- Jumanah Escalera emphasizes the importance of community engagement and safety during the events.
