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## **MUNICIPAL SERVICES**

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> Ongoing work will consist of test pits to determine utility locations and building foundations, street and station surveys and design work.

The proposed benefits for riders will be in improved station with new elevators, raised ADA boarding areas, ADA compliant sidewalk curbs, AFAS gates, Braille signage, structural improvements, fire alarm and new CCTV, electrical upgrades, and architectural upgrades for the stairs.

The design-build contract was awarded on December 31, 2020. Overall project completed is anticipated in July 2023.

# **NEW YORK CITY DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION**

**Ms. Lauren Rennee Project Manager** said that the presentation was on the proposed Jackson Avenue Bike Boulevard, Jackson Avenue between East 138<sup>th</sup> Street and Westchester Avenue.

The Open Streets program began operation in 2020 and became permanent in 2021 and was announced in each borough selected to be a Bike Boulevard in 2021. The project goals are to improve safety for people walking and biking by reducing through traffic and to enhance bike network open street and park access.

The Citywide protected bike lane network builds 30 miles of protected bicycle lanes annually integrating and installing new street design treatments including bike boulevards to prioritize cyclists, and limit vehicles. Citi Bike Phase 3 expansion plan included Community District 1, and the concept is roadway design approach that prioritizes pedestrian and bicycle safety, reduce vehicles with traffic calming elements, reduce volume and through traffic with regulatory changes e.g. one-way conversions, forced vehicular turns, improve wayfinding with signage and roadway markings with special attention to major intersections.

The proposed one-way conversion would be one-way-northbound on East 138<sup>th</sup> Street to St. Mary's Street; one-way-southbound on St. Mary's Street to East 149<sup>th</sup> Street; and one-way-northbound on East 149<sup>th</sup> Street to Westchester Avenue. The benefits of a one-way conversion are a reduction in vehicular turn conflicts with people walking and biking, a reduction of through-traffic volumes and maintains local vehicle access to the corridor.

The proposed addition of bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure on East 138th Street to St. Mary's Street.

- To convert Jackson Avenue to one-way northbound
- Install two-way bike path along west curb connecting to East 138<sup>th</sup> Street, Randall's Island Connector, Willis Avenue Bridge.
- Redirect trucks away from neighborhood streets.
- Will improve conditions at East 138th Street and Bruckner.

#### **MUNICIPAL SERVICES**

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The proposed addition of bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure on St. Mary's Street to East 149th Street.

- To convert Jackon Avenue to one-way southbound.
- Install two-way bike path along park, across the street from school.
- Reduce likelihood of congestion caused by double parking.

The proposed addition of bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure on East 149<sup>th</sup> Street to Westchester Avenue.

- To convert Jackson Avenue to one-way northbound.
- Install bike path along east curb to minimize parking loss between Pontiac Pl. and East 149<sup>th</sup> Street due to driveways.
- Add new crosswalks at East 151<sup>st</sup> Street, Pontiac Pl.
- Reduce likelihood of congestion caused by double parking.on

The proposed safety improvements on Jackson Avenue at East 138th Street.

East 138th Street is a Vision Zero Priority Corridor.

The existing condition on Jackson Avenue at East 138<sup>th</sup> Street is that the southbound left-turning vehicles block the box creating significant congestion on East 138<sup>th</sup> Street approaching Bruckner Blvd due to short block.

East 149<sup>th</sup> Street is a Vision Zero Priority Corridor.

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The proposed improvement of safety at intersections on Jackson Avenue at East 149<sup>th</sup> Street is for vehicles on Jackson Avenue oriented away from East 149<sup>th</sup> Street in both directions.

Pedestrians and cyclists traveling along Jackson Avenue would have and exclusive traffic signal phase with no vehicular conflicts.

Allows bike land users to switch from east to west curbs while crossing East 149th Street.

The next steps will be Stakeholder Engagement and to begin the implementation of the Bike Boulevard in Summer-Fall of 2021.
