BRONX COMMUNITY BOARD #10 DISTRICT SERVICE CABINET MEETING November 20, 2018

District Manager Cruz commenced the meeting at 10:04 AM with a brief tribute to Joe Boiko, a Board Member and District Service Cabinet Member representing Riverbay Corporation, who passed away in October. Mr. Boiko was a hard working individual, dedicated to serving the Coop City community. He appreciated working with Agency representatives and was grateful for the opportunity to work with those present.

Mr. Cruz invited those present to introduce themselves. He noted that the 45th Precinct was not present as they were attending a promotion ceremony for Captain Ghonz who is being elevated to Deputy Inspector at 1 Police Plaza. Mr. Cruz congratulated Captain Ghonz. Mr. Cruz said that the precinct will provide information after the meeting.

FDNY - B.C. McDade

Borough Chief McDade submitted statistics.

There were no announcements and since there were no questions and he had another meeting to attend, Borough Chief McDade excused himself.

Transit Police

Transit Police were not present, however Mr. Cruz indicated that when they are unavailable for the meeting they usually provide an update afterwards.

NYC Transportation Dept. (DOT) - D. Alcantara, E. Riquelme

Ms. Alcantara introduced Emily Riquelme, a new Borough Planner at NYC DOT. Ms. Riquelme will be accompanying Ms. Alcantara to future District Service Cabinet meetings.

Ms. Alcantara reported that the Agency will have an update at the January District Service Cabinet meeting on the request for a Safety Crosswalk at Preston High School (Schurz Avenue & Brinsmade Avenue) DOT 351945, filed 10/2017.

A response to the question of traffic signal timing on Jarvis Avenue at Bruckner Blvd. DOT-388037-L6B0, is due tomorrow. Nov. 21, 2018. Ms. Alcantara will email updates and provide them at the January meeting.

The request for removal of "No Parking" signs on the Roberts Avenue side of Our Lady of the Assumption Church, 1617 Parkview Avenue, will be removed from the Agenda, as the church is reluctant to relinquish the spots.

Ms. Alcantara responded to the request for cleaning at the Express Bus Stop BXM9 on the Cross Bronx Expressway Service Road past Randall Avenue by reporting that the Agency does not have the capacity to clean such areas. The arterials department cleans parkways and the lot cleaning division handles City owned lots. There is no resource to clean areas outside DOT fencing.

Mr. Cruz reported that he will refer the Bus Stop cleaning issue to FEDCAP. Ishrael Gonzalez of Council member Gjonaj's office reported that the Council member had already submitted the area to FEDCAP. Mr. Cruz thanked Council Member Gjonaj.

Ms. Alcantara requested 311 #s for the request for repaving of the Bruckner Expressway overpass on East Tremont Avenue and the repaving of Ellsworth Avenue, between Fairmount and Layton Avenues due to ponding issues.

The due date for a response for the request for an all way stop sign at the intersection of E. 196th St. and St. Paul Avenue is March 11th. Such requests take up to 16 weeks. The DOT work order number is DOT – 397 319 F8B1.

The request for a traffic signal at the intersection of Crosby and Coddington Avenues has a March 11, 2019 response due date. The DOT work order number is DOT 397 217 F4Z5. Ms. Alcantara indicated that this request will most likely be denied as this issue was reviewed less than three years ago, and the agency typically does not revisit issues prior to three year intervals. Mr. Cruz stressed that there have been many accidents at this intersection.

Ms. Alcantara responded to the Board's inquiry about a meter placed on Wenner Place. The meter does not belong to DOT; other institutions also utilize meters. It is located on a fire hydrant, not the roadway.

Mr. Cruz also relayed that the Board had received complaints about foliage extending onto the roadway along Shore Road from the Bartow Circle to the county line northbound and from the Circle to the entrance of the Hutchinson River Parkway southbound. Ms. Alcantara was not sure whose jurisdiction this maintenance would fall under and pledged to get clarification.

Mr. Cruz also inquired about resuming work on designating bike lanes on Brush Avenue. Ms. Alcantara relayed that there was considerable community backlash when work was being done. The agency would like that issue to be remedied before the work is resumed.

Mr. Cruz indicated that he wouldn't be opposed to using plastic barriers to secure the bike lanes. Mr. White of Con Edison offered that at Van Courtland Park the bike lanes are placed between the curb and the parking lanes to provide additional safety.

State Transportation Dept. (State DOT)

Mr. Cruz indicated that since State DOT is not present, he will email the following Agenda Items to them for follow up:

- New England Thruway Authority Status of road surface repairs on the New England Thruway between Exits 8 and 13 north and south bound
- Illuminated Billboard at Westchester Avenue Overpass of Hutchinson River Parkway

Transportation Dept. - Bridges - R. Fernandez, A. Bayer

Mr. Fernandez reported that the Westchester Avenue Overpass project is nearing the completion of stage 1 and will be moving to the north side. The water main and bridge deck are done. The north side will begin in January or February.

Ms. Bayer reported on the Unionport Bridge Project. The foundation for the two temporary lift bridges should be done by the end of this year, weather permitting. It is difficult to maintain the roadway of the existing bridge as it is in poor shape. Overall the project is running smoothly. Traffic agents are present daily.

Mayor's Office (CAU) - F. Konneh

Mr. Konneh's announcement that the new Bronx Animal Shelter had been confirmed was met with applause from the cabinet. Mr. Cruz noted that though the Board was opposed to the location, Council Member King was very successful in securing meaningful amenities for his community which we should be proud of: improvements to the dangerous "killer curve" area, possible downzoning of the billboard zoning lot, and a new Beacon Program at Truman High School.

Mr. Konneh announced that a NYC ID pop up site will be located at Westchester Square Library in December, 2018. Mr. Cruz requested a blurb/flyer for distribution. It will be near the Army Career Center from December 10th to the 12th, from 10 AM to 5 PM.

Mr. Konneh indicated that he will follow up on NYCHA issues noted on the Agenda. He had followed up on the elevator issue at 680 Balcom Avenue which was fixed, but now the other elevator is down.

Department of Parks and Recreation - K. Zagorski, Ray Combest

Ms. Zagorski reported that at Owen Dolen Recreational Center renovations are currently underway and Parks is working with contractors on the roof project. Care is being taken that existing roof leaks do not affect the renovation work.

The Windows and doors project is in the design phase. The project should be completed by March 2019.

Mr. Cruz announced that the Board's Parks and Recreation Committee has a new Chair, Terrence Franklin. Mr. Cruz requested a guided tour with Parks of Pelham Bay Park, to familiarize Mr. Franklin with the scope of this invaluable resource.

Ms. Zagorki was not familiar with the Board's request for maintenance at Bufano Park. Mr. Cruz indicated that this was a District Needs item and a request for a face lift of the park. Mr. Cruz agreed to email the details.

Ms. Zagorski reported on the inquiry concerning the availability of the roller hockey rink. The Permit was not renewed to the roller hockey league, therefore it is available.Ms. Zagorski announced that a public hearing for community input concerning the Orchard Beach Pavilion would be held at Lehman High School on Tuesday, December 4th at 7:30 PM. Community input is welcomed.

Mr. Ray Combest announced that on Thanksgiving Day, November 22nd, from 11 AM to 3 PM, at Owen Dolen Recreational Center, Thanksgiving Dinners will be served to the needy.

Department of Sanitation Enforcement (DSNY) - SEA II S. Jones

SEA II Jones had no announcements and reported that he will provide enforcement at the areas mentioned on the Agenda: Longstreet Avenue and Wissman Avenue, and the Express Bus Stop BXM9 on the Cross Bronx Expressway Service Road past Randall Avenue (cross Bronx Expressway) as well as along the private residences.

Mr. Cruz stressed the need for enforcement at dirty tree pits on the East Tremont Avenue and Westchester Avenue corridors.

Superintendent Mason reported that DSNY has been issuing tickets for high weeds and litter. He also provided services at the Express Bus Stop BXM on the Cross Bronx Expressway Service Road.

Department of Sanitation (DSNY) - Superintendent Mason

Superintendent Mason reported on the snow storm of Thursday, November 15th. He noted that prior to the snowfall, 80% of Board 10's roadways were salted. Accidents on the Cross Bronx and backups caused by the George Washington Bridge closure caused traffic backups which grounded DSNY vehicles and prevented highway and roadway clearing.

Mr. Mason reported on the Boards long standing request for lot cleaning behind Griswold Avenue. Upon inspection there was no sign of rodents or garbage, only overgrowth. Therefore the request was denied by lot cleaning.

Mr. Cruz relayed that he had also spoken with the owner and offered FEDCAP services, but she declined. Because it is privately owned, there is nothing further the Board can do.

Ms. Peralta-Downing offered to send an inspector who could issue a Commissioner's Order, but only if visible evidence of the presence of rodents is detected.

Superintendent Mason will submit any additional clean-up sites for FEDCAP as they arise.

Con Edison - B. White, R. Infante

A request was received from Parks to remove a portion of a tree at 3167 Parsifal Place which is in close proximity to electrical conductors, however, it was not submitted as a priority and won't be accomplished until sometime next year.

Mr. White reported that Con Edison met with the homeowner of 155 C Edgewater Park concerning their mold issue. Con Edison claims that it is not related to their work, but an ongoing leak a 168 C. Edgewater Park. The Con Edison representative spoke with a general contractor at 168 C and learned that the leak was cured a week prior. The owner of 155 C Edgewater Park agreed to monitor the condition and see if the mold dries up since the water source has ceased.

Buildings, Dept. of (DOB) - S. Nuzzo

3250 Westchester Avenue remains in disapproved status as of October 22nd. Mr. Nuzzo will check on the number of stories being proposed for this site.

The billboard issue at 500 Baychester Avenue is still with the Department of Building's legal department.

Mr. Cruz noted that one of the concessions won by Councilman King in the Animal Shelter negotiations was that City Planning will evaluate downzoning the area where the billboards are located, which can determine its fate.

Mr. Nuzzo reported that on October 10, 2018, a full demolition for 2115 Burr Avenue was signed off on. There are 11 parking spaces at this site.

3273 Westchester Avenue had necessary permits and will be removed from the Agenda. A stop work order was issued on October 2, 2018 at 1051 Hollywood Avenue. Their hearing date is approaching. Illegal excavation was observed.

The Safe Buildings Unit was consulted on 2018 Continental Avenue. Roof repair work was done. Judge adjourned this hearing until Jan. 28th.

Roof work at 2878 Sampson Avenue did not require a permit, however, a violation for the height of the fencing was issued.

1820 Edison Avenue, proposed 6 story building without parking, remains in disapproved status. There are 10 dwelling units. Parking may be waived.

2925 Greene Place - Alt 1 220671146, has been disapproved. Mr. Cruz cited a law that if an individual owes more than \$25,000 in civil Penalties, they should not be issued new permits. Mr. Nuzzo clarified that permits can be issued to correct hazardous ECB violations, which require repair. Mr. Nuzzo will provide additional information.

Mr. Nuzzo reported that at 1525 Research Avenue, C1-1-1641614221 inspectors found the property closed and sealed. Ms. Kilkenny reported that per the next door neighbor, the side door in the alley is unlocked.

An inspection of 3551 E. Tremont Avenue found the chimney to be in good condition. The condition is concerning to the neighboring business. Failure to maintain violations were issued for cracks in the bricks.

Mr. Cruz reported that there was oil leaking though a wall. Mr. Nuzzo requested photos.

Mr. Cruz inquired about an application on Baisley Avenue. Residents feel it was never a two family home. Mr. Cruz will forward an email concerning this request.

Environmental Protection Dept. (DEP) - E. Ardizzone

Ms. Ardizzone reported that the water supply is good. Complaints have ceased. This item will be removed from the January Agenda.

Ms. Ardizzone reported that repairs to a water main on Erskine Place at the I-95 underpass is being worked on. Special material was ordered for this repair and when it arrives it will be addressed. There is no time frame for this repair, but it is expected to be repaired shortly. Ms. Ardizzone requested that all homeowners be encouraged to clear leaves and debris from catch basins near their homes.

MTA - J. Carter

Ms. Carter distributed flyers and palm cards promoting the ongoing transit survey. The Agency is anxious to receive customer feedback and is offering free fairs.

The MTA Board will determine if fairs will be increased. Fairs haven't been increased since 2015. There will be a rate increase hearing on November 29, 2018, at Hostos Community College. It is one of 8 hearings to be held throughout the City.

Health Department (DOH) - E. Peralta-Downing

Ms. Peralta-Downing reported that as of December 2018, mobile food vendors will receive a letter grading. Vendors are required to have their letter visible at all times and a tracking device will be installed on every cart. The program will take two years to become fully functional.

Mr. Cruz noted that legionnaire's disease had been found elsewhere in the City. He inquired about the condition that was remedied in Co-op City. Ms. Peralta-Downing reported that they continue to monitor the buildings that tested positive, to ascertain that they remain clear. They were tested recently, but the results are not yet in. It takes two to three weeks to cultivate the samples. The Agency will publicize the results.

Town and Country - Z. Garland

Ms. Garland discussed a new program, City FHEPS that as of Oct. 29, will be replacing link and PHEPS program. The new program has more incentives for landlords to participate. Rental amounts have been increased. This is new to landlords and may take time to publicize.

A new criteria with this program is that housing providers are now charged with having potential properties inspected.

Department of Consumer Affairs (DCA) - T. Rahman

Ms. Rahman provided an update on pop up carwash activity and the agency's efforts to have operators apply for licensing which is now mandatory. Investigators visited the following reported sites: Cross Bronx Expressway and East Tremont, Bartow Avenue, near 2050 Bartow, and Commerce Avenue between Zerega and Seabury Avenue.

Investigators found one operator on Zerega Avenue, but none at the Cross Bronx Expressway or Bartow Avenue locations. At the Zerega Location, the operator was provided with application material to apply for his license.

Ms. Rahman reported that a law suit was filed against Berkley College because they were deceiving students concerning student loans. A press release with specific information will follow.

Senate Jamal Bailey's Office - Ashley Meza

Ms. Meza announced that Senator Bailey and the 47th Precinct are co-sponsoring a coat drive. Coats can be dropped at the Senator's Office: 959 E 233 Street. Coats will be distributed on January 8th.

Due to the results of the recent elections, the State Senate expects to get a lot more accomplished during the upcoming session.

The Senator's office also has turkeys for distribution to needy families. Those interested should contact the office.

Council Member Mark Gjonaj's Office - I. Gonzalez

Mr. Gonzalez announced that Council Member Gjonaj was hosting a turkey giveaway today and yesterday and asked that anyone in need call their office. A truck with turkeys was curbside at the office.

Mr. Gonzalez also noted that there were about 30 spots available for FEDCAP snow removal. Seniors in the Councilman's district can call to be added to the list.

Assembly Member Michael Benedetto's Office - J. Adams

Mr. Adams announced that Covenant House is planning to come to the Bronx.

Mr. Cruz indicated that he had spoken with Sr. Nancy Downing who wants to operate transitory housing for youth near St. Peter's residence. Mr. Cruz did not know what contract level they are at, but that they hoped to open next year.

Mr. Adams announced that the rescheduled Halloween event, the Ragamuffin Carnival and Contest, would be held at Preston High School from Noon to 4 pm on Saturday, November 24th.

Mr. Cruz indicated that there was no District Service Cabinet meeting in December and that the next Board meeting would be held on January 17, 2019 at 2959 Jean Jugan Residence.

Mr. Cruz announced the following:

- Renovations will begin shortly at McDonalds, 3660 East Tremont Avenue.
- Board Minutes form 2017 will be removed from the CB10 website to keep the site current.
- The developer of the proposed hotel at 2100 Bartow Avenue is uncertain if they want to continue with the project
- Home Energy Assistance Program applications are available. Constituents can seek assistance at the Board Office.

Mr. Cruz thanked all for their attendance and wished all a Happy Thanksgiving.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:50 AM.
