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- ii. Proposed By-Law Amendments (not up for a vote this month; request February 2021 committee meeting minutes for details):
  - 1. Update Article V Section 2 to to require a written reason for removal from a committee
  - 2. Clarify the language in Article III Section 4 (a) and 4 (b) regarding the number of committee meeting and full board absences that may serve as cause for removal from the board. The number of committee meetings and full boards meetings that a board member may miss before being considered for removal from the board will not change but the two sections will be re-drafted for clarity and for brevity. Additionally, the contents of the revised section(s) will be disseminated to the full board so that they are aware of their attendance requirements
  - 3. Update Article III Section 4 (c) (2) so that an e-mail notification is now permitted when notifying a member subject to removal (immediately followed by a telephone call) requesting acknowledgement within FIVE BUSINESS DAYS. If acknowledgment by the member subject to removal is <u>not</u> received by the Community Board office within five business days only then will notice by certified mail be required
  - 4. Add a reference in the bylaws to NYC's sexual harassment policy, add a web link in the bylaws to the policy then in effect (as the city may periodically update the policy) and add a reminder in the bylaws that all board members are bound by the policy
  - 5. Update Article VI Section 3 to require ULURP hearing notices be posted on the Board's website
  - 6. Update Article VI Section 9 to require the recitation Pledge of the Allegiance at the beginning of virtual meetings of the full board

## **Conduct Statement**

Community Board 11 meetings should be held in a professional and hostile free environment.

The following guidelines are applicable to members of the public, Community Board 11, and Community Board 11 staff:

- Any personal attacks against a board member, staff member, member of the public, or elected official or their representative at any particular meeting will result in the individual being asked to leave the meeting and could result in the meeting's closure.
- Any inappropriate outburst during any meeting may result in the individual(s) being asked to leave. If outbursts or attacks continue, this may be considered disturbing the peace, and authorities may be summoned. If the meeting is held remotely, the person will be muted or expelled for the remainder.
- All public speakers must address and face Community Board 11 members with their concerns.
- Electioneering for a position other than an officer of the Community Board is prohibited.

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
